Cross border healthcare: many obstacles, many added value


Emergency services (DE-FR-CH)

- Despite many transnational agreements rather few cross-border operations
- Administrative and legal hurdles (e.g. use of special signals and rights of way, insurance coverage to be assured for assistance services in the neighboring country, use of own communication equipment, recognition of driving licenses.
- · Cultural, legal and systematic differences
- Lack of data basis/ intercultural skills/ knowledge management
- Stakeholders mainly acting in isolation (lack of exchange and network



Mobile X-Ray car (NO-SW): VälTeL

- Brings the X-ray equipment to the patient
- Saves money
- Less travel for patients
- More examinations
- Fewer hospital admissons
