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This publication presents the state of the art of the projects co-financed by the Interreg VI-A Italy-Slovenia 2021–2027 Programme until December 2025.

There are 3 operations of strategic importance, 25 capitalization projects, 46 standard projects and 68 small scale projects, co-financed by the Small Projects Fund (SPF), implemented within the framework of the EGTC GO/EZTS GO cross-border area between the municipalities of Gorizia, Nova Gorica and Šempeter-Vrtojba.

In 2025, two Monitoring Committees of the Interreg VI-A Italy-Slovenia 2021-2027 Programme were held. The first took place in April in Portorož, while the second Monitoring Committee met in December in Ljubljana.

The Interreg Annual Event 2025 – Interreg GO!, which took place from 26 to 28 March 2025 in the cities of Nova Gorica and Gorizia, celebrated European cross-border cooperation. The event brought together more than 650 participants, including representatives of European, national and regional institutions, as well as representatives of the Managing Authorities and Joint Secretariats of all European Interreg Programmes. It opened with the Youth Event, dedicated to youth engagement, featuring the award ceremony for the video contest “Italy–Slovenia in 30 seconds”. On 27 March, panels were held on politics and international cooperation, as well as the Interreg Slam 2024–2025, together with the award ceremony of the school competition “Students4Cooperation”. On 28 March, European Authorities discussed the 2021–2027 programming period, Strategic Integrated Operations (OSI) and Specific Objectives (ISO).

Within the framework of the EURegionsWeek–CloseToYou Edition, the workshop “Stronger Together: Turning Cross-Border Synergies into Future Growth”, promoted by the Interreg Italy–Slovenia Programme with the involvement of the PR FESR FVG Programme, brought together more than 30 participants and 15 Interreg projects. The aim of the workshop was to launch new cross-border synergies in view of the 2028–2034 programming period. Divided into two groups focusing on sustainable tourism and culture/creative industries, the meeting generated proposals to improve accessibility, enhance cultural heritage and promote inclusion and sustainability through digital tools. Participants agreed to continue the dialogue, with a follow-up meeting scheduled in Grado in spring 2026.

This publication describes all the projects financed by the Programme, divided by Policy Objectives. Each project is described in a fact sheet, which provides an overview of:

- budget and duration;
- project summary and objectives to be achieved;

## **THE INTERREG VI-A ITALY-SLOVENIA 2021-2027 PROGRAMME**

**The Interreg VI-A Italy-Slovenia 2021-2027 Programme** was approved by the European Commission with the execution decision C(2022) 5745 of 3 August 2022.

The Programme covers the seven-year European programming period 2021-2027 and is developed with a view of continuity and capitalisation with what was achieved in the previous period 2014-2020, which financed 63 projects in the fields of competitiveness, research and innovation, protection and enhancement of cultural and natural resources and cross-border services.

With a budget of just over 88.6 million euro, the Interreg VI-A Italy-Slovenia 2021-2027 Programme bases its strategy on the following Policy objectives:

1. **a more competitive, innovative and intelligent Europe (Policy Objective PO1),**
2. **a greener Europe towards a net-zero carbon economy (Policy Objective PO2),**
3. **a more social and inclusive Europe (Policy Objective PO4),**
4. **a better governance of cooperation (Interreg Specific Objective ISO1).**

These objectives are broken down into Specific Objectives.

### **Institutional Programme Partners**

The Programme involves two European Union Member States. Institutional partners are the Republic of Italy, which participates with the Friuli Venezia Giulia Autonomous Region and the Veneto Region, and the Republic of Slovenia, which participates with the Vzhodna Slovenija and the Zahodna Slovenija regions.

REGIONE DEL VENETO

The Veneto Region confirms its strong commitment to the European Cohesion Policy as a key instrument for reducing regional disparities and promoting concrete development. The Interreg Italy-Slovenia Programme has proven to be a powerful instrument for addressing the shared challenges of the cross-border area, delivering tangible results in terms of connectivity, resilience and innovation. Together we will continue shaping a more cohesive, competitive and citizen-oriented Europe.

## Programme Area

The area covered by the Interreg VI-A Italy-Slovenia Programme extends over an area of 19,841 km<sup>2</sup> with a total population of approximately 3 million inhabitants.

At the NUTS 2 level, the Programme area therefore involves 2 Italian regions, Veneto and Friuli Venezia Giulia, and 2 Slovenian regions, Vzhodna Slovenija and Zahodna Slovenija.

The Programme area comprises 10 territorial units at NUTS3 level, of which 5 on the Italian side, i.e., for the Autonomous Region of Friuli Venezia Giulia, the former provinces of Udine, Pordenone, Gorizia and Trieste and for the Veneto Region the metropolitan city of Venice (former province of Venice) only, and 5 on the Slovenian side with the statistical regions Primorsko-notranjska, Osrednjeslovenska, Gorenjska, Obalno-kraška and Goriška.

The cooperation area encompasses various spatial development models. A particular example is represented by the functional area between the municipalities of Gorizia (IT), Nova Gorica and Šempeter-Vrtojba (SLO), where a European Grouping of Territorial Cooperation (EGTC for short) - the most advanced form of cross-border territorial cooperation at European level - has been operating since 2011. Its objective is to incentivise a shared governance in the health sector as well as modernisation and innovation in the fields of environment, infrastructure, urban transport, logistics, energy and economic development.

The Programme area, which is highly heterogeneous in geographical terms, includes coastal areas, mountain ranges, rural and urban areas (Trieste, Udine, Gorizia, Nova Gorica, Ljubljana, Pordenone, Venice, Koper, Izola, Piran, Kranj and Postojna) and lagoon areas.

## Budget and Policy Objectives

The Programme's financial plan amounts to a total of 88,623,329.00 euro, of which 70,898,662.00 euro is provided by the ERDF and 17,724,667.00 euro by national co-financing.

From the total endowment of the Programme, an overall percentage of 7% will be deducted to be allocated for Technical Assistance, unlike in previous Programmes. Therefore, the ERDF allocation available for projects actually amounts to a total of 66,260,431.00 euro.

As for the ERDF co-financing rate for projects is 80%. For Slovenian project partners, each beneficiary has to provide the remaining 20% from its own resources. For all Italian partners the remaining 20% is covered by the Rotation Fund for Development and Cohesion.

The budget supports four Policy Objectives and Technical Assistance:



**Policy Objective 1:** A more competitive and smarter Europe by promoting innovative and smart economic transformation and regional ICT connectivity.



**Policy Objective 2:** A greener, low-carbon transitioning towards a net-zero carbon economy and resilient Europe by promoting clean and fair energy transition, green and blue investment, the circular economy, climate change mitigation and adaptation and risk prevention and management.



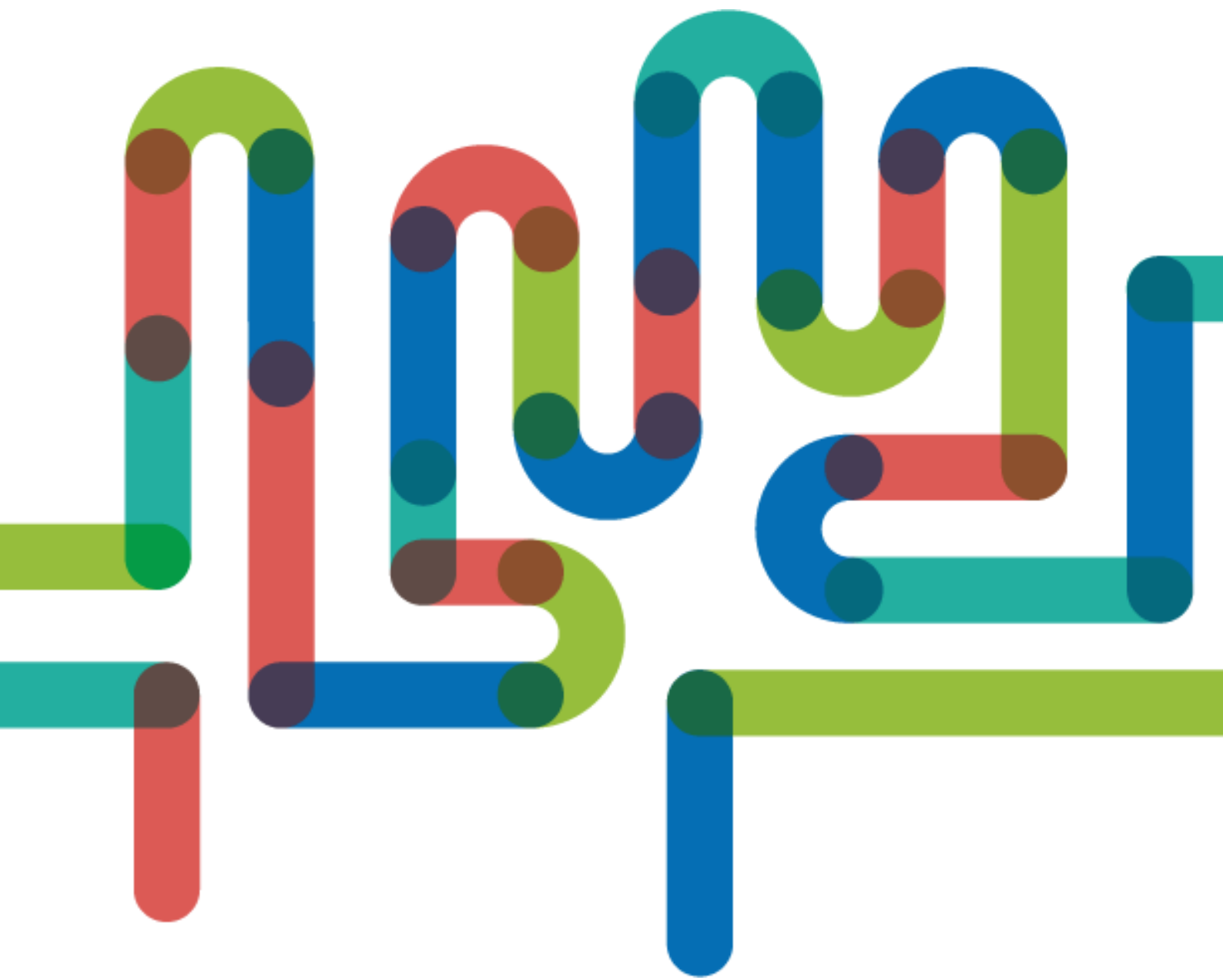

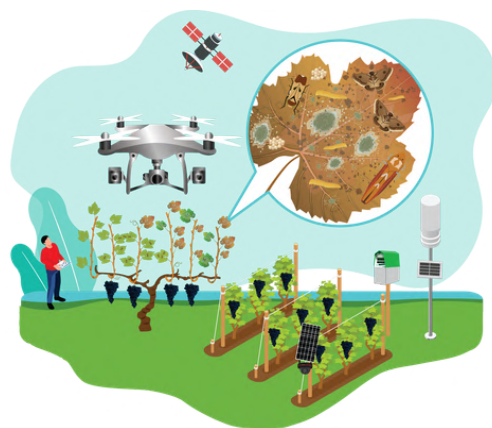
Developing and enhancing research and innovation capacities and the uptake of advanced technologies.

### Challenges and expected results

- Key challenges: to mitigate the negative effects of the pandemic on the cross-border economy, to enhance innovation capacity, industrial research, business digitization, and to simplify the administrative side.
- Expected results: to develop technological solutions aimed at fostering the inclusion of older and vulnerable people; to provide social and health services through technological solutions (e.g., telemedicine); to improve technology transfer to SMEs; to strengthen cooperation between research and innovation centres and businesses by increasing the continuity of investment in R&D and applied research; to reduce development disparities through social innovation; to capitalize on the best practices achieved and to strengthen the diffusion of ICT, through which we also want to improve bilingual services to citizens and businesses.

**Under Policy Objective 1, 9 projects are co-financed: 4 capitalisation projects and 5 standard projects.**

**PROJECT SUMMARY**

The AI-GRAPE project brings together partners from Slovenia and Italy to develop an artificial-intelligence-based decision-support system aimed at fostering sustainable and competitive grape production and improving vineyard protection through innovative technologies.

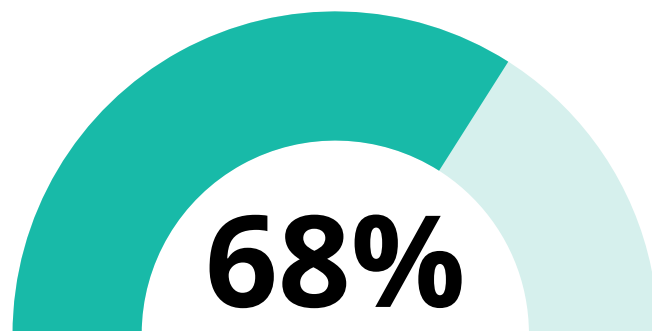
**MAIN PROJECT OBJECTIVES**

AI-GRAPE aims to integrate data from weather stations, micro-environmental sensors, drones and insect traps into an AI-based decision-support system. AI-driven analysis will enable more sustainable viticulture. The key innovation is data integration to build predictive models that anticipate pests and diseases, allowing rapid and targeted interventions.

**OUTPUT**

The project continued with the installation of equipment in the vineyards and the collection of data for the deliverables. The prototype of the AI-GRAPE DSS has been finalised and the cross-border monitoring network has been launched. Validation activities, drone surveys, data sharing among partners and impact assessment have also continued.

**PROJECT SUMMARY**

The ALL-MICRO project creates an advanced optical and electron microscopy network in the Italy-Slovenia macro-region. It brings together universities, research centres and technology hubs to support public and private organisations in accessing state-of-the-art microscopy techniques. The network connects academia, research and industry, providing scientific expertise, high-end instrumentation and services to foster innovation and competitiveness.

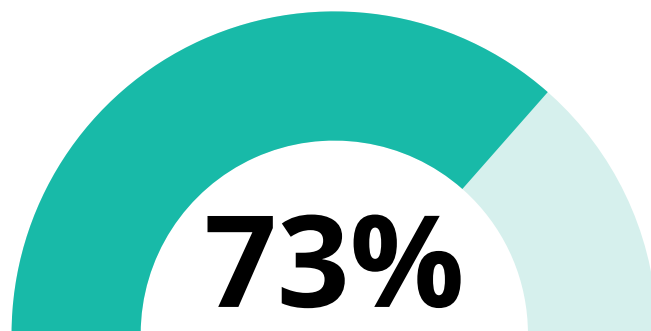
**MAIN PROJECT OBJECTIVES**

The main objective of ALL-MICRO is to democratise access to advanced optical and electron microscopy techniques and facilitate their use in research, industry and services. By raising awareness of recent technological innovations and offering proof-of-concept experiments and collaborations, the network aims to bridge the gap between academia and industry, improve technological capabilities and strengthen the competitiveness of the Italy-Slovenia macro-region and neighbouring areas.

**OUTPUT**

ALL-MICRO activities included monthly meetings, newsletters and the launch of the online portal presenting equipment, expertise and services. Two cross-training events and a three-day Autumn School were organised. Knowledge dissemination took place through two mirror events in Slovenia and Italy, participation in Trieste Next 2025 and presence at the 17MCM and CNCS conferences. Finally, eleven pilot-project applications were evaluated and eight were completed.

**MAIN PROJECT OBJECTIVES**

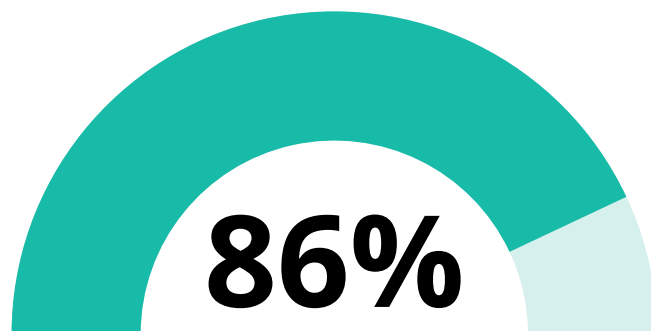
BioTech2Agri aims to increase innovation in the agri-food sector of the Italy-Slovenia cross-border area by transferring existing biotechnological potential and promoting networking among academia, the public sector and the private sector. The project supports the exchange of knowledge and good practices to enhance competitiveness and regional growth.

The project strengthens agri-food innovation through biotechnological solutions, supports knowledge transfer and collaboration between companies and institutions, increases the competitiveness of SMEs and contributes to sustainability by promoting more efficient use of resources and a reduction in pesticide use.

**OUTPUT**

**STATE OF ART**

In July 2025 a call for SMEs was launched: forty companies will receive four innovation-support services. In May, a call for solution providers followed. Stakeholder mapping and a methodology for the technological components were initiated and, using PREZI, a list of potential solutions was compiled.

**PROJECT SUMMARY**

The COHERENCE project aims to develop an open cross-border platform designed to guide researchers through regulatory processes and support the introduction of advanced therapies in the Italy–Slovenia area. Through a pilot action based on a clinical study for the treatment of difficult-to-heal wounds, the project will test the platform’s effectiveness, improve access to innovative care and streamline cross-border regulatory pathways, strengthening cooperation among research centres, hospitals and enterprises.

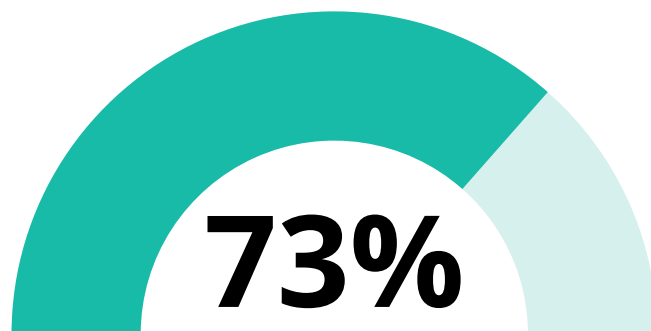
**MAIN PROJECT OBJECTIVES**

The project seeks to develop a cross-border platform that provides regulatory guidance for advanced therapies; facilitate collaboration among research centres, hospitals and companies; launch a pilot clinical study for treating complex wounds; accelerate biomedical innovation; and improve access to advanced therapeutic solutions.

**OUTPUT**

On the scientific side, culture media have been selected and tested, and cell-expansion trials have begun under controlled conditions to ensure safety and reproducibility. On the regulatory front, Slovenian partners have initiated procedures with JAZMP to obtain authorisation to operate as a donor centre. The project has been presented at a major congress on chronic ulcers. Preparations are currently under way for the documentation needed to officially launch the clinical study.

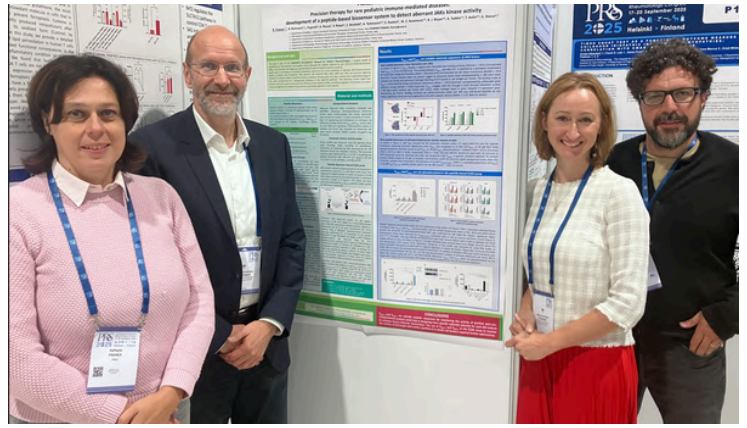

**PROJECT SUMMARY**

Rare paediatric immune-mediated diseases can require different diagnostic and therapeutic strategies. It was observed that the two main paediatric hospitals in the Programme Area used different therapeutic approaches and diagnostic tools. The CONCERTO project therefore addresses the harmonisation of clinical approaches and therapeutic strategies across the two clinical centres, while creating a network of hospitals, research centres and SMEs and developing feasibility studies for new diagnostic tests.

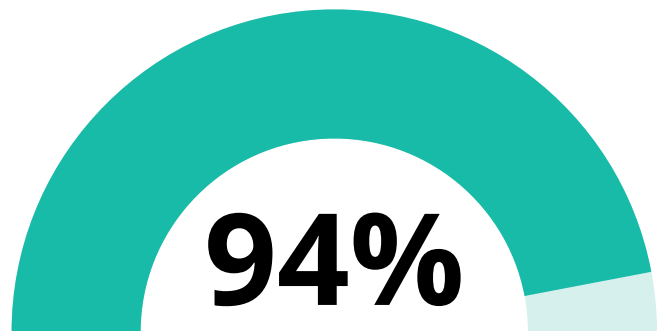
**MAIN PROJECT OBJECTIVES**

CONCERTO ("CrossbOrder Network for ChildRen RheumaTology") aims to valorise, transfer and disseminate specific deliverables produced by the CATTEDRA project. It intends to further develop the jointly built database of patients affected by rare immune-mediated diseases in children in the Programme Area and to capitalise on a feasibility study for a diagnostic test for rare paediatric diseases.

**OUTPUT**

The CONCERTO project is in its final phase. An improved cross-border database on rare paediatric immune-mediated diseases has been implemented and enriched with new data and functions. In addition, a new feasibility study for an innovative diagnostic test has been conducted, producing encouraging preliminary results. The final event is being organised, where the achieved results will be presented.

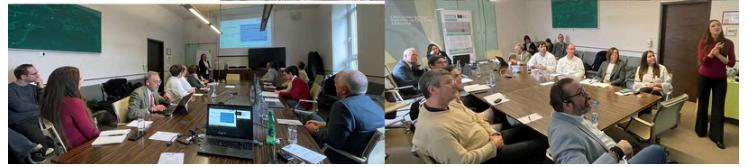

**PROJECT SUMMARY** **MAIN PROJECT OBJECTIVES**

The aim of IMMUNOCLUSTER-2 is to initiate a clinical study with the advanced cell-based medicinal product aHyC at interregional level. The project supports cross-border cooperation to improve the quality of life of residents.

The project aims to launch a clinical trial for the treatment of triple-negative breast cancer (TNBC) using a cellular vaccine (aHyC) and to provide access to cutting-edge, personalized, and affordable oncology therapies in the cross-border region. The project also seeks to enhance innovation capacity and the adoption of advanced technologies, strengthen cooperation among companies, healthcare institutions, and research centers, and build upon the results of the previous IMMUNOCLUSTER project.

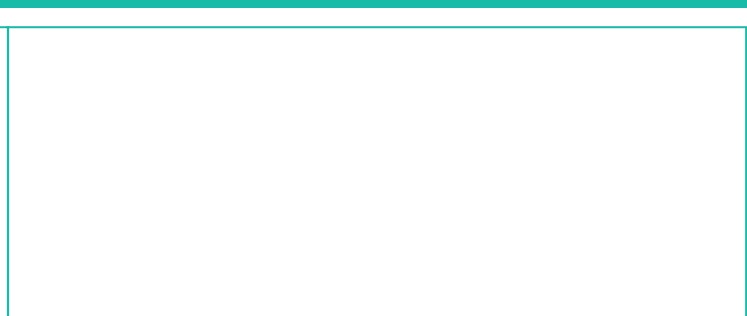
**OUTPUT** **STATE OF ART**

The project concluded with the final event held on 5 December 2025. An intermediate nDC product was prepared in seven iterations under GMP conditions and the quality results were used to draw up the final protocol in a production environment. Additional preclinical research was conducted and the results were included in the documentation for the clinical-trial application. Italian patients have been informed about the possibility of inclusion in the study.

**PROJECT SUMMARY**

**MAIN PROJECT OBJECTIVES**

PRO-SIS is the capitalisation project of CONSTRAIN, which experimentally investigated the effectiveness of interventions to reduce the seismic vulnerability of existing masonry buildings using fibre-reinforced composite materials. It focused on one-sided interventions on walls to avoid relocating occupants or to allow the preservation of protected façades. PRO-SIS concentrates on design strategies for these interventions for use in professional practice.

The project's main objectives are to develop analytical correlations for reliable design; to define numerical procedures to be used in common commercial software to account for the effects of the interventions; to apply them to case studies, such as a public residential building and a culturally protected one; and to prepare guidelines on design and application procedures.

**OUTPUT**

**STATE OF ART**

Sophisticated numerical simulations were carried out to define reinforcement design criteria, and simplified analyses were performed to calibrate implementation procedures using common calculation software. Based on the guidelines prepared for the "CONSTRAIN" strategies, numerical models investigating the seismic vulnerability of the two case studies, before and after intervention, were developed, and executive drawings and detailed bills of quantities were produced.

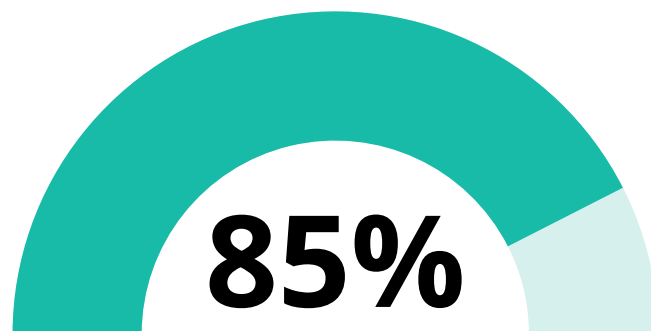

**OUTPUT**

The project is expected to conclude in April 2026 and is currently in its final phase. A risk analysis related to the use of the Translate4Rail automatic translator is underway, along with laboratory and field testing based on communication exchanges between traffic controllers and train drivers in Italy and Slovenia. These activities aim to ensure railway interoperability while maintaining the same safety standards.

The X-BRAIN.net project aims to enhance research, innovation and technologies within hospitals in the Programme Area. Post-stroke patients occupy around 15% of healthcare capacity and require prompt rehabilitation. In a bilingual territory, cross-border cooperation is essential to guarantee high-quality healthcare services.

The project aims to review, transfer and improve the bilingual post-stroke neuro-cognitive and motor rehabilitation protocols developed under the MEMORI.net project; create new rehabilitation service solutions in the cross-border area; and promote the preservation, revitalisation and enhancement of both tangible and intangible heritage.

**OUTPUT** **STATE OF ART**

X-BRAIN.net project concluded on 31st August 2025, having achieved all its objectives. Post-stroke rehabilitation rooms are now operational in Italy and Slovenia, and specialised staff have been trained in the new technologies and methodologies. The partners have also signed an agreement to further develop and strengthen the results achieved.

The BeBlue project builds on the results of BLUEGRASS by promoting aquaponics, an innovative and sustainable food-production technology based on the principles of the circular economy. The initiative introduces digital tools to simplify system management, develops sustainability assessment methods, tests the cultivation of marine species and supports the integration of aquaponics into urban-regeneration processes, strengthening cross-border cooperation.

**MAIN PROJECT OBJECTIVES**

The project aims to expand aquaponics by implementing measures that enable easier system management through digitalisation, improve investment opportunities by developing tools for assessing environmental and economic sustainability, broaden the range of products through the combined cultivation of marine fish, salicornia and macroalgae, and promote the inclusion of aquaponics in urban-regeneration planning.

**OUTPUT**

In 2025, the BeBlue project partners carried out virtual tours of aquaponic systems, technical visits to pilot sites, webinars and training activities on aquaponics sustainability. The stakeholder network was reinforced, plenary forums were organised, and a presentation at a trade fair and final event were held. Videos and online updates were published, and the release of a bilingual publication further supported the development and promotion of aquaponics.

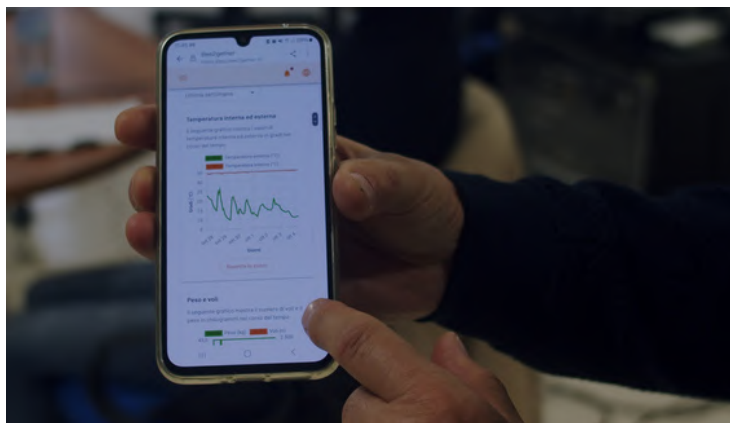

The BEE2GETHER project further develops the innovative management model introduced by the BEE-DIVERSITY project, which is based on two tools: electronic hives and a web app enabling beekeepers to remotely manage their apiaries. Pollen analysis is then used to identify environmental pollutants and determine the most suitable and sustainable agricultural practices for biodiversity conservation.

The project capitalises on the sustainable agricultural practices and pilot actions developed under BEE-DIVERSITY to support biodiversity conservation and protection. It expands and strengthens bee monitoring through the electronic hive and web-app system and promotes the transfer of knowledge to new areas by involving stakeholders outside the partnership, including beekeepers, farmers, associations, schools and regional institutions.

The project concluded on 31 August 2025. The electronic hives continue to record data in the areas where they were installed, and the web app remains fully operational.

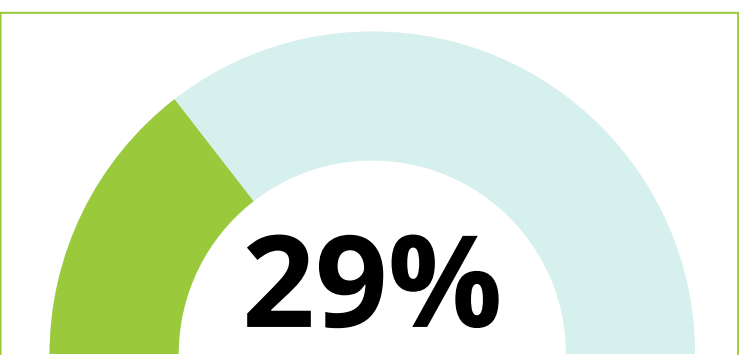
**PROJECT SUMMARY** **MAIN PROJECT OBJECTIVES**

The BioTiles project develops biotechnologies based on natural fibres and microbial biofilm designed to reduce sediment resuspension and naturally increase ecosystem resilience. The effectiveness of the biosubstrates is tested both in an artificial channel through fluid-dynamic trials and at demonstration sites located in cross-border lagoon areas most affected by erosion, with the aim of enhancing biodiversity, ecological complexity and ecosystem resilience.

The project aims to increase biodiversity and improve the resilience of lagoon ecosystems through the development and application of innovative biosubstrates in a pilot study conducted in areas vulnerable to climate change. It also seeks to consolidate fragmented knowledge on biodiversity loss and lagoon ecosystem resilience into a single hub through a Memorandum of Understanding for the creation of the Lagoon HUB.

**OUTPUT** **STATE OF ART**

During project activities, coconut fibre was selected for the production of the biomat tiles following a comparative study involving jute and hemp. A series of site inspections with preliminary sediment sampling and physico-chemical characterisation was carried out, leading to the selection of Sacca di Vallis in Marano and Stjuža in Strunjan as demonstration sites. Existing biodiversity data geoportals were also mapped in preparation for the establishment of the Lagoon HUB.

The BLUECRAB project carries out targeted interventions for the control, mitigation and management of blue crab populations through a cross-border approach in the coastal area of the northern Adriatic. Activities include continuous monitoring using gear suitable for selective fishing based on sex and reproduction, as well as the development of guidelines to promote blue crab consumption. Project actions take place in strategic target areas identified together with local fishermen.

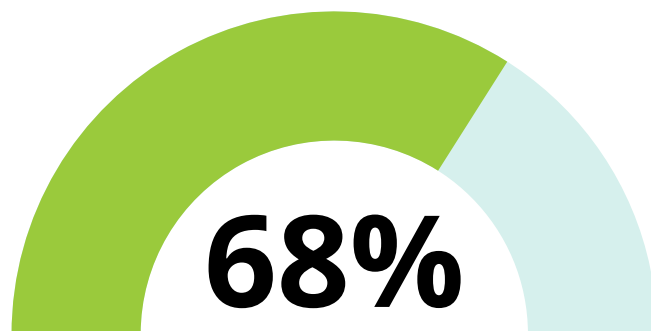
**MAIN PROJECT OBJECTIVES**

The project aims to establish a shared framework for governance and collaboration on blue crab research, activate integrated and comparable monitoring with adjacent areas outside the programme territory, and develop early-warning and rapid-response capabilities to address emergencies. It also seeks to create a cross-border database (Observatory) for information exchange on this invasive crustacean and provide solutions for protecting clam and mussel farms.

**OUTPUT**

The Monitoring Plan has been completed and a report has been presented including catch data and analyses of size, sex ratios and reproduction. The cross-border Blue Crab Observatory has been created. Two exchange visits were carried out to facilitate the collection and sharing of experiences and information, and two workshops were held, culminating in the approval of the Action Plans. A cross-border strategy has also been defined for monitoring the impact of blue crab on fisheries supply chains.

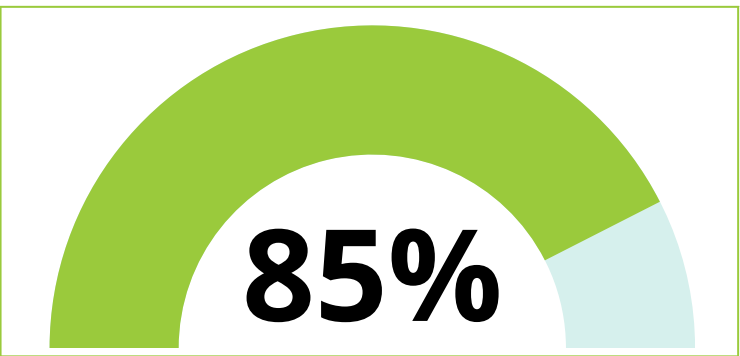
**PROJECT SUMMARY** **MAIN PROJECT OBJECTIVES**

The Circular.Buildings project promotes the circular economy in the construction sector across the Italy-Slovenia area by defining strategic guidelines on the most relevant innovations and international best practices for the local context. It also develops a cross-border "Circular Building" web portal offering networking functions and tools for all stakeholders, and provides growth pathways for companies through pilot tests and workshops.

The project aims to foster the development of a circular economy in the cross-border construction sector by removing obstacles linked to weak networking among operators. The initial field analysis, which identifies the barriers preventing the adoption of virtuous practices, enables interventions both at system level and in strengthening the skills of individual operators, supporting a real paradigm shift.

**OUTPUT** **STATE OF ART**

The project has completed four sector analyses (innovations with a focus on AI-based tools, best practices, construction-waste legislation and field analysis) and launched fourteen workshops, scheduled to conclude in January 2026. Nearly all twenty educational video clips have been recorded for social media release in February 2026. Development of the cross-border circular-construction web portal is also ongoing and planned for completion in February 2026.

The CircularRainbow project promotes sustainable and circular trout farming in the Italy-Slovenia cross-border area in response to climate-change challenges. Through innovative RAS systems and circular-economy practices, the project recovers wastewater to produce biogas and insect-larvae biomass. Supported by cross-border cooperation, it seeks to optimise resources, digitalise processes and disseminate sustainable models aligned with the Green Deal and Blue Economy strategies.

The project supports the transition of trout farming toward circular models by adopting digitalised RAS systems to reduce water dependence, recover resources from wastewater and improve efficiency and animal welfare. It aims to strengthen agri-food self-sufficiency by training qualified staff, promoting sustainable practices, engaging policy makers and raising awareness among producers and consumers to support economic and environmental sustainability in the sector.

**OUTPUT**

**STATE OF ART**

In 2025, pilot RAS systems for trout farming were consolidated, reducing waste and resource use. Sustainable feeds were developed, data on fish welfare collected and water-quality monitoring improved. Residual materials are being studied to produce energy and nutrients through insect bioconversion. A digital model is under development, and the team is participating in fairs and outreach events to promote innovation and engage businesses interested in RAS systems.

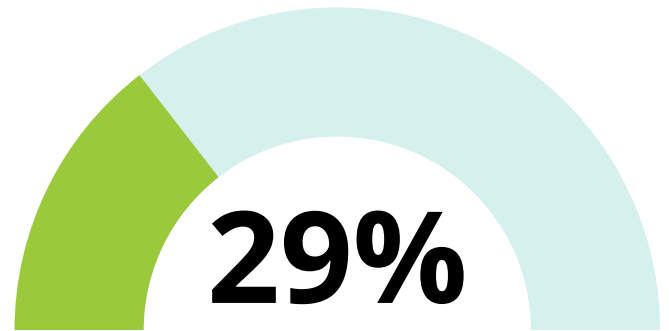

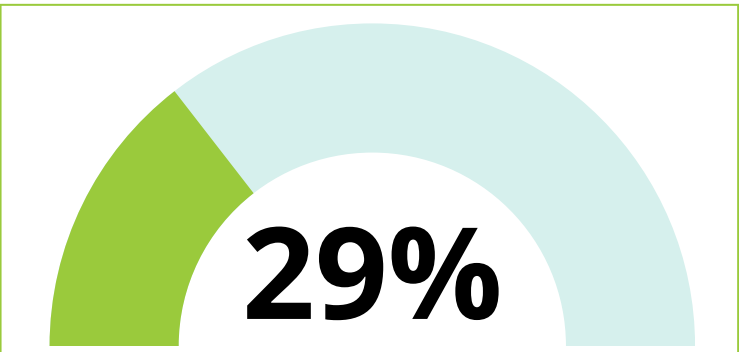

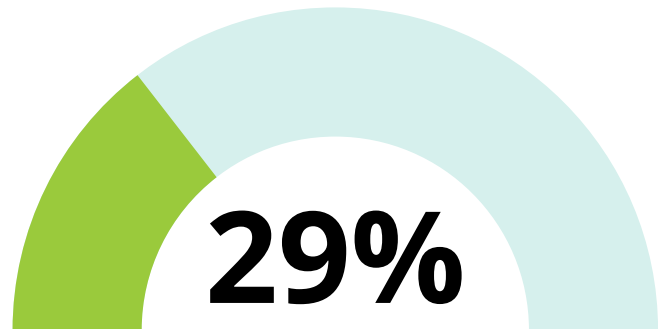

The project aims to reinforce the resilience of the Italy-Slovenia cross-border area to seismic and landslide risks by establishing a unified monitoring and response network. It seeks to harmonise disaster preparedness, real-time monitoring and emergency response to reduce the impact on communities, infrastructure and the environment, ensuring greater safety and faster interventions through enhanced regional cooperation.

**OUTPUT**

In its initial phase, CONCORDIA coordinated preparatory activities by organising the kick-off meeting and working groups for the Work Packages. Procurement and testing of seismic and GNSS instrumentation began, common methodologies were defined and training and communication activities planned. These actions consolidated the cross-border network and established the project's operational foundations.

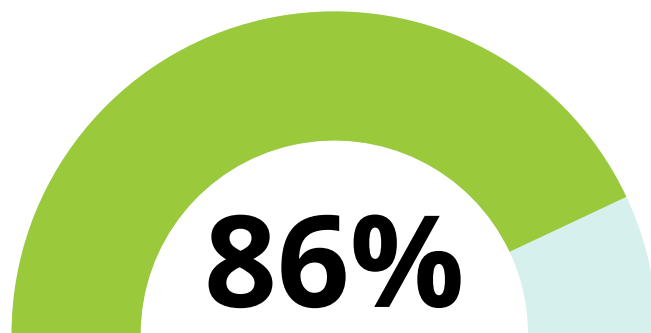

Several awareness-raising activities have been carried out, and a joint cross-border exercise is currently being prepared.

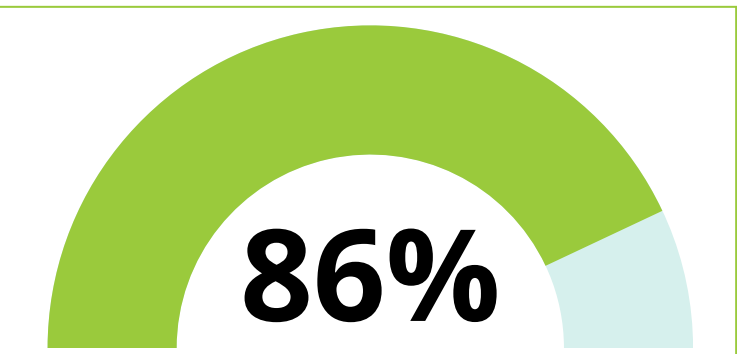

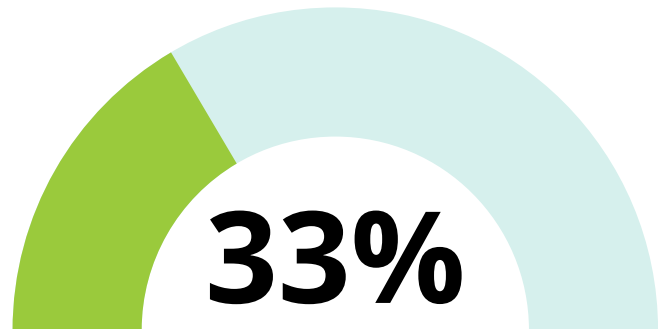

The main goal of the project is to intensify cross-border cooperation and develop a bilingual web application that enables citizens and local authorities to access real-time data on atmospheric pollution and black-carbon levels, supported by an extensive measurement dataset. The project also aims to test pollutant-degradation processes and develop guidelines for identifying emerging climate-related pollutants that require future monitoring.

**OUTPUT**

The project is in its operational start-up phase with the first concrete actions underway. Monitoring locations for black-carbon measurement have been identified, and weather-proof enclosures for the instruments are being constructed to enable reliable outdoor operation. In parallel, the experimental plan for studying degradation of selected climate-related pollutant categories is being finalised.

It achieves this through the preparation of two action plans, the integration of territorial data with electronic platforms for air-rescue operations and additional mapping for the Friuli Venezia Giulia and Veneto regions, as well as joint training activities including a practical exercise.

**OUTPUT** **STATE OF ART**

Project partners have updated the territorial data needed to integrate the new action plans. The HEMS Action Plan and the Emergency Management Plan of the Metropolitan City of Venice have been completed. A joint training plan has been developed and the main cross-border practical exercise took place from 5 to 8 June 2025 in the municipalities of Gorizia, Nova Gorica, Šempeter-Vrtojba and Ajdovščina.

**PROJECT SUMMARY** **MAIN PROJECT OBJECTIVES**

The IRRIGAVIT project aims to strengthen the resilience of cross-border viticulture through sustainable water and soil management protocols. The project builds on the results of Acquavitis by transferring innovative technologies and protocols tested in the area and, through meetings, video lessons, experimental trials, and on-field demonstrations, provides guidelines for winegrowers.

The project aims to optimise and transfer irrigation strategies for cross-border viticulture and for wider territories, and to present experimental evidence of irrigation and vineyard soil-management protocols using innovative green technologies. It focuses on promoting and providing training through workshops, video lessons and international conferences, as well as offering professional support to key decision makers and stakeholders in the agricultural sector to facilitate climate-change adaptation.

**OUTPUT** **STATE OF ART**

Forty technical meetings and thirty-eight events, including workshops, campaigns and training activities, have been carried out. Sampling and monitoring activities took place in eight cross-border vineyards, with analyses performed on grapes, soil and plants using DSS tools, multispectral instruments and the Irrigavit.eu platform. Guidelines on irrigation and soil management have been presented, and to support knowledge transfer to winegrowers, six wine-tasting events were organised in Italy and Slovenia.

The KARST ADAPT project addresses climate-change adaptation and natural disasters such as wildfires, floods and hailstorms. Its innovative approach develops along four main lines: a bottom-up participatory process, the use of innovative methods to ensure that public investments are resilient to natural disasters, the creation of a cross-border animal-evacuation protocol and improved communication among municipalities, citizens and organisations in the cross-border area.

The project aims to strengthen the capacity of local communities to cope with the consequences of climate change while fostering cross-border cooperation. It seeks to improve equipment and skills among organisations and the population, develop a shared protocol for animal rescue, enhance communication mechanisms and establish a permanent forum to strengthen cooperation for harmonious and sustainable cross-border development.

In 2025 the project took part in a joint conference on natural disasters and organised seminars and workshops in January, February and October. Project partners purchased the planned civil-protection equipment, and training sessions were held in Slovenia on advanced rope-technique use, water rescue, psychosocial support and first aid. Building on research aimed at improving knowledge of wildfire behaviour, the project identifies climate-change adaptation measures and implements selected actions through pilot interventions.

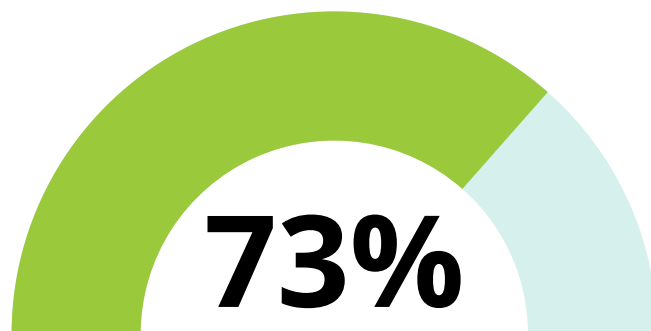
**MAIN PROJECT OBJECTIVES**

The project aims to develop a cross-border strategic vision to reduce wildfire risk in the Karst. With a long-term climate-adaptation perspective, it develops a knowledge and data base to support early detection of fires and assess the vulnerability of forest and grassland ecosystems. It also implements pilot actions using ecosystem-based and ICT-based approaches.

**OUTPUT**

The project is in its final phase. Several pilot actions have already been implemented on the Slovenian side (grazing activation, Karst grassland restoration, thermal cameras), and at least one pilot action will be carried out on the Italian side. The knowledge base has been completed, stakeholder-interaction activities are ongoing and expected to conclude by March 2026, and the final conference is scheduled for late May 2026.

**PROJECT SUMMARY** **MAIN PROJECT OBJECTIVES**

Due to climate change and the increasing wildfire risk in natural environments, the KARST-SAFE project focuses on preparing preventive measures to protect the population and settlements in the Karst cross-border area. Partners work with specialised institutions and stakeholders to develop joint solutions for wildfire prevention.

The project will prepare an action plan with the aim of harmonising measures across the cross-border Karst area. Based on this action plan, public calls will be launched in the pilot area to support the implementation of preventive measures, addressed to individuals and organisations operating in different sectors. Protective equipment will be purchased, and training programmes will be carried out to support preventive actions.

**OUTPUT** **STATE OF ART**

In cooperation with partners and institutions, workshops, cross-sectoral meetings and an action plan for preventive measures have been organised. A public call has been published, and, together with local farmers, the planned wildfire-protection measures have been implemented: 183 hectares of new grazing areas in Sežana, Komen, Duino-Aurisina and Monrupino. The fire brigades of Sežana and Nova Gorica have purchased new equipment and have carried out training activities on prevention.

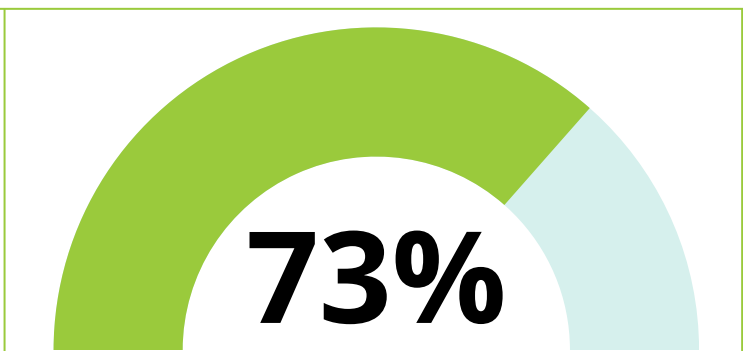
**PROJECT SUMMARY** **MAIN PROJECT OBJECTIVES**

The Kras4us project addresses the challenges related to protecting and conserving biodiversity in the unique yet threatened Karst area. It intends to implement three pilot actions to conserve and restore green infrastructure such as dry grasslands, ponds and stone walls, to assess biodiversity in areas affected by wildfires and, for the first time, to monitor indicator species of community importance, which have so far been less monitored.

The main objectives of the project are to conserve and restore biodiversity in the cross-border Karst area through the monitoring of bioindicator species and the protection of green infrastructure. In addition, the project aims to develop a strategy for the sustainable management of N2K species and habitats in the Karst, promoting a circular economy and using waste biomass, including material originating from wildfires and overgrown Karst grasslands, for energy production.

**OUTPUT** **STATE OF ART**

Meetings with stakeholders have been held to prepare a biodiversity map. A pilot action for the creation of grasslands has been completed, and surveys of birds, pollinators and vegetation have been carried out. A programme of biology evenings has been created, and workshops on grassland conservation and a botanical-ornithological walk have been organised. The data collected will be used to develop a circular-economy approach based on biomass and a shared strategy for sustainable management.

The PALLIPES project includes four pilot actions and a cross-border strategy to safeguard the white-clawed crayfish *Austropotamobius pallipes* in the Italy-Slovenia area. Cross-border cooperation is essential to protect the species across its entire range through distribution monitoring, restoration of degraded habitats, improvement of water quality in the Timavo/Reka river, eradication of invasive species, awareness-raising and the use of innovative technologies such as eDNA.

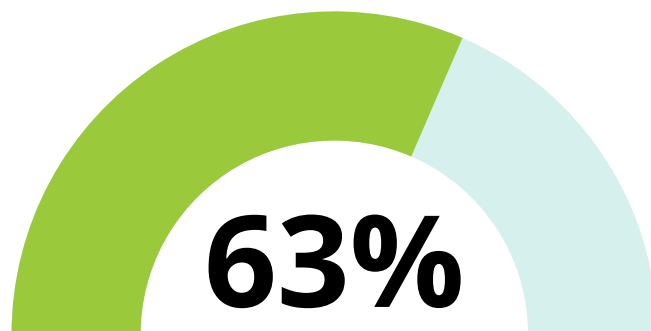
**MAIN PROJECT OBJECTIVES**

The objective is to improve cross-border cooperation for the protection of the white-clawed crayfish *Austropotamobius pallipes*, in full respect of the environment and taking into account future scenarios linked to climate change. Target groups include managers of protected areas and Natura 2000 sites, researchers, public agencies, students and citizens. Project results will include shared and innovative approaches centred on *Austropotamobius pallipes*, a biological indicator of ecosystem conservation status.

**OUTPUT**

In the third reporting period, partners monitored the crayfish using eDNA (116 samples), cleaned up five illegal dumps, installed an educational trail at a wastewater treatment plant and created an app for septic-tank registration. Workshops, school laboratories, a theatre performance and technical meetings were carried out. Species-distribution models and a shared cross-border database were developed, and habitat-monitoring and invasive-crayfish-eradication services were launched.

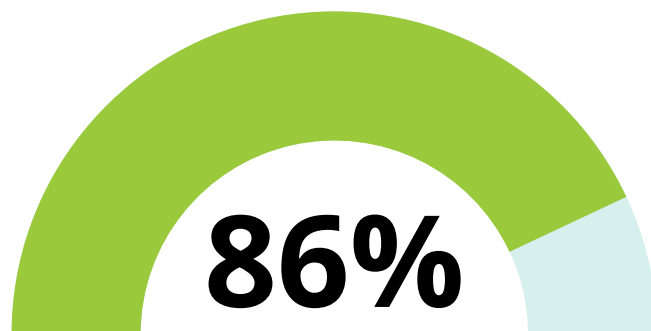

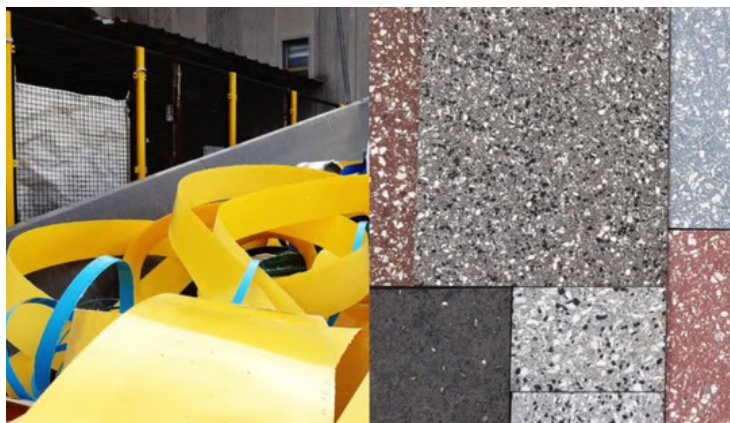

The RECREATE project proposes a circular economy model for fibre-reinforced composite materials (CFR), with the aim of improving environmental sustainability by reducing the amount of waste produced and optimising the management of CFR waste.

**MAIN PROJECT OBJECTIVES**

Building on the results achieved with the RETRACKING project, RECREATE involves an Italian public body and a Slovenian company in defining and applying a new circular approach. The project's objectives include the collection and preparation of CFR waste, the development of replicable guidelines for its management, the production of certified items to be used in public spaces or production processes and the development of acquisition and export protocols compliant with regulations.

**OUTPUT**

The project concluded with a series of key events, including a study visit to a CFR-recycling plant and a training activity for companies. Operational materials were also delivered, such as export guidelines and protocols for acquiring circular products. The CFR products developed and tested were transferred to Spinea and Technol. Final events and dissemination materials contributed to strengthening the cross-border recycling and reuse model.

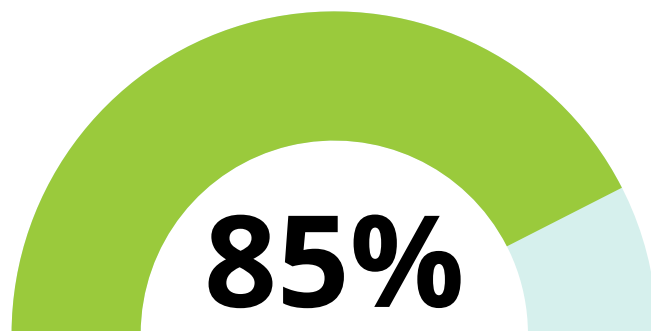
**MAIN PROJECT OBJECTIVES**

The most important results produced in the second period are the historical databases “of SIF works”, “of management actions in the pilot basins”, “of remote-sensing data” and the “protocol for data access and sharing”. Maps showing geomorphological changes and the “maintenance priority index” for structures located in the pilot basins have also been produced.

**PROJECT SUMMARY** **MAIN PROJECT OBJECTIVES**

The TRECap project aims to initiate a process to improve the management of Natura 2000 sites by sharing selected good practices. To begin building shared management strategies, the project has focused on climate change impacts and on *Pinna nobilis*, a species at risk of extinction. Concrete actions are accompanied by communication and training activities in order to promote a cross-border vision and ensure transferability and long-term durability.

The objective of the project is to improve the management of all protected sites in the northern Adriatic by providing replicable examples of good practices, such as a climate change monitoring network and a cross-border strategy for the management of *Pinna nobilis*. The main innovative element lies in the joint approach, which is capable of generating results at northern-Adriatic scale.

**OUTPUT** **STATE OF ART**

The project ended in December 2025. Geological, geophysical and photogrammetric surveys have been completed, along with activities relating to genetic characterisation, engineering species and bottom-temperature measurements. The widespread mortality of *Pinna nobilis* observed during the project limited the collection of juveniles for replanting. Numerous networking and dissemination activities were carried out through the project website, social media channels and the YouTube channel.

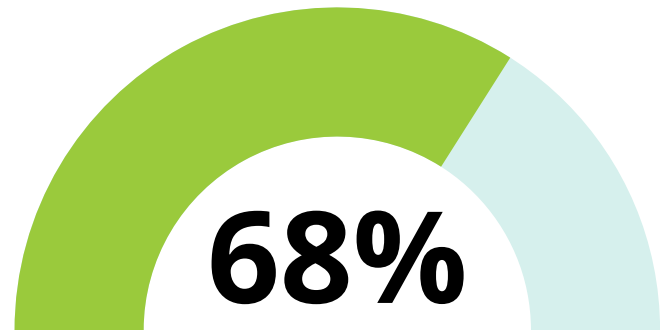

The WABIN project aims to strengthen the capacity for shared management of groundwater and surface water through the development of predictive and participatory tools for water balance assessment. The main objectives include carrying out integrated hydrogeological analyses, defining climate change adaptation strategies, reducing water losses and raising public awareness of the importance of sustainable water use.

**OUTPUT**

In 2025, WABIN continued geophysical and hydrogeological investigations in the Merna-Vipacco area, updating the GIS model with new geoelectric data to assess seasonal variations in sediment water content. The project took part in Researchers' Night-Street Science in Trieste and in the Water Festival in Mirano, organised a focus group in Maniago and Koper and published the fifth edition of "The culture of Ditches", in addition to completing the mapping of territorial needs.

Through cross-border measures, it promotes the reduction of environmental impacts and the adoption of sustainable practices.

The main objective of the project is to reduce the environmental impact of waste in the participating municipalities (Postojna, Izola, Nova Gorica, Venice and Duino-Aurisina) through improved waste management, the promotion of recycling and reuse and increased environmental awareness among the local population.

It studies the properties of degraded wood and develops innovative processes and prototypes for new uses. Stakeholders are involved through workshops to share knowledge and enhance the value of damaged wood in a sustainable perspective.

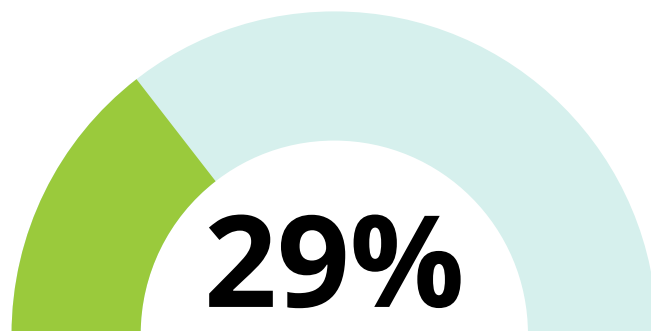
**MAIN PROJECT OBJECTIVES**

The project focuses on assessing the impacts of climate change on the forest-wood chain, on defining models to enhance the value of damaged wood and on identifying more resilient species. The project develops wood-modification processes and prototypes of sustainable products, promotes training and dedicated events and strengthens cross-border cooperation, ensuring the transfer of results to businesses and public institutions.

**OUTPUT**

Launched in June 2025, the project is finalising the assessment of wood damaged by extreme events. Wood attacked by the bark beetle has been collected for further analysis, experimental piles have been prepared and monitoring of cutting times and storage conditions has begun. Initial durability tests and studies on wood reuse are under way. At the same time, a competition for primary- and secondary-school students has been prepared.

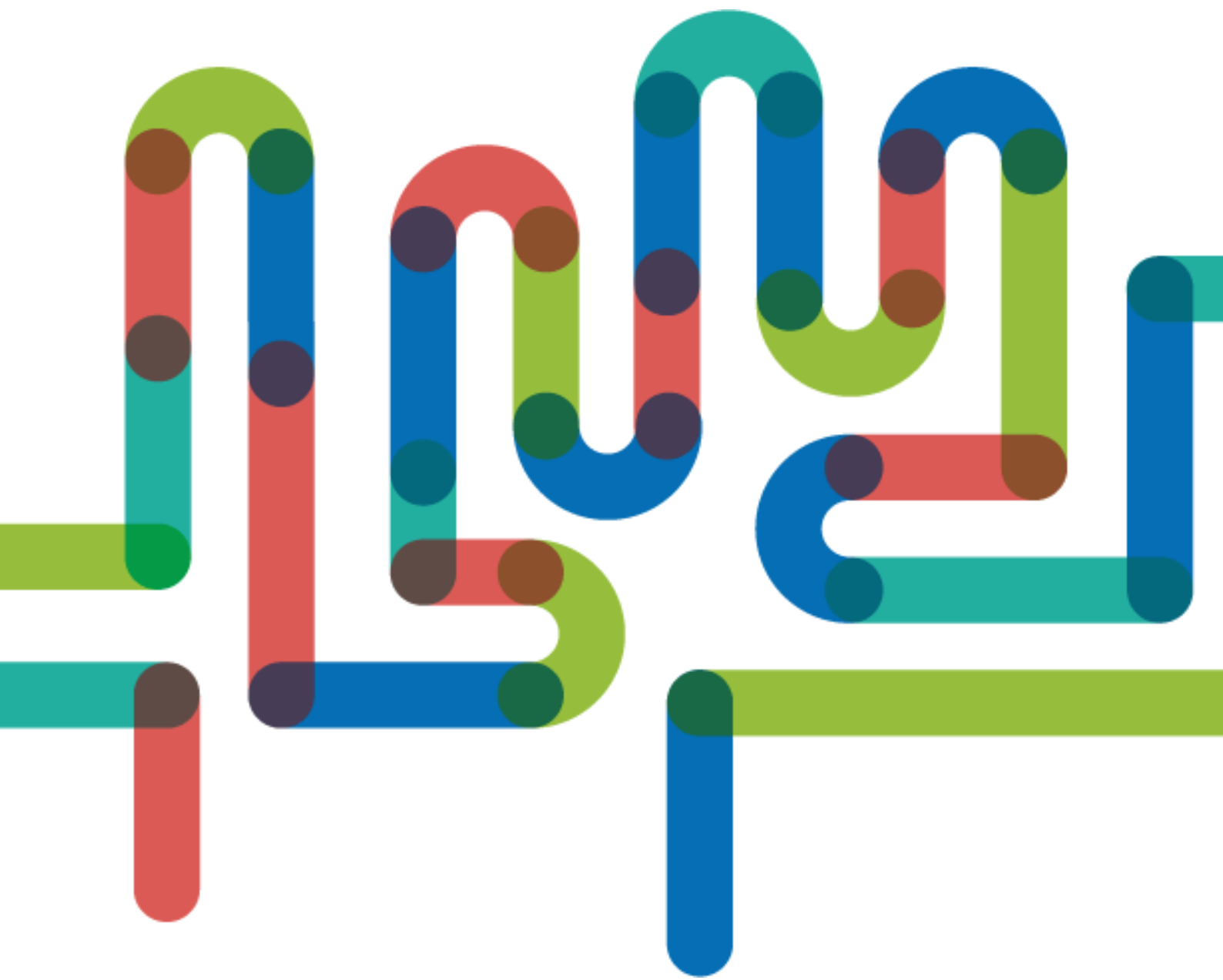

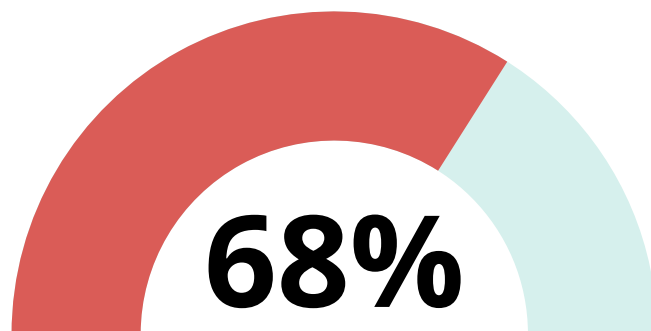
### MAIN PROJECT OBJECTIVES

The INTER BIKE III project transfers good practices in the development of cycle tourism along the Adriabike cycle route (Kranjska Gora-Ravenna) from the two previous projects of the same name to the new areas of the Brkini and the valleys of the Torre and Natisone rivers. A new cycle-tourism product has been developed: the 300 km long Alpina Mediterranean cycle route from Venzone to Opatija, presented on the renewed website [bike-alpeadria.eu](http://bike-alpeadria.eu).

**MAIN PROJECT OBJECTIVES**

The project contributes to the development of cycle tourism in the cross-border area, improves cycling infrastructure, enriches the range of services for cyclists, increases the visibility of the cross-border area as a cycle-tourism destination with the new Alpine Mediterranean Cycle Route and aims to make public passenger transport by bus and rail more efficient in the Obalno-Kraška region.

**OUTPUT**

Within the project, two bike-bus services have been introduced: Ajdovščina-Cividale del Friuli and Vipava Valley-Predmeja. An electric boat has been built and is operational in the Caorle Lagoon and on the Lemene river, and a landing pier has been constructed in Cavanella. New rental bicycles are available in Ilirska Bistrica and San Pietro al Natisone, and three new charging stations have been installed in Ilirska Bistrica. A study on public transport in the Obalno-Kraška region has also been completed.

The RecapMCV project further develops the MerlinCV project by enhancing and promoting digital products and defining a digitalisation strategy for cultural heritage, thereby increasing the visibility of the cross-border tourist region. Through studies, the transfer of good practices and pilot projects, it introduces innovative ways of reusing products and promotes sustainable use of heritage while encouraging cross-border cooperation.

The project aims to develop innovative digital cultural-heritage products and offer solutions of European relevance for the development of sustainable tourism. It seeks to make professional use of the unused heritage of castles and villas through storytelling in thematic itineraries, ensuring the enhancement and transfer of good practices, expanding existing digital content and defining a strategy for the sustainable digitalisation of cultural heritage.

**OUTPUT**

Within the project, a mobile immersive room has been set up, an action plan has been prepared and archaeological research has been carried out on Kozlov rob near Tolmin. A multilingual strategy for the use of immersive rooms has also been prepared, the MerlinCV platform has been updated with thematic itineraries and linked to educational content. Finally, promotional-training videos have been produced and cross-border events have been organised to promote digital heritage.

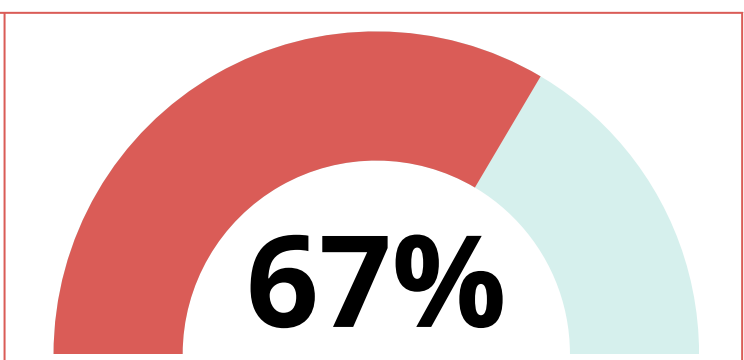
**PROJECT SUMMARY** **MAIN PROJECT OBJECTIVES**

The GO! 2025 Small Projects Fund is a tool financed by the Interreg VI-A Italy-Slovenia Programme and managed by EGTC GO, whose main objective is to support the preparation of the cross-border area for the European Capital of Culture Nova Gorica - Gorizia 2025.

The SPF intends to finance, on the basis of annual calls for proposals published by EGTC GO, small projects within the specific Objective 4.6 of the Programme. These small projects will aim to “strengthen the role of culture and sustainable tourism in economic development, social inclusion and social innovation”.

**OUTPUT** **STATE OF ART**

Under the first SPF call, 27 projects were financed. In 2024, additional funding (€3.2 million) was secured from the FVG Region, making it possible to finance a further 17 projects from the first call's ranking list. In total, all projects from the first call were funded with an overall value of €7,669,091.16. The second call, published in 2024, has funded 12 projects for a total value of €1,437,803.14. The third call was published in September 2025, with planned funding of €1,026,839.17.

The TARTINI BIS project pursues and strengthens conservation, research and dissemination activities related to the heritage of Giuseppe Tartini, extending the investigation to the European network of his students and admirers. At the same time, the project aims to reinforce knowledge of this heritage in the cross-border area and among a broader international audience, contributing to the development of a sustainable and integrated tourism offer in the Programme Area. Through the identification, cataloguing and digitalisation of new Tartini-related sources, the project seeks to foster the transfer of good practices among partners.

The WALKofPEACE+ project aims to create an integrated cross-border tourism offer to attract greater tourist flows. It capitalises on the success of the previous WALKofPEACE project (awarded as Best Interreg Project 2020), which created the “WoP” brand and developed a route of over 500 kilometres with more than 300 monuments, promoting historical research, the preservation of First World War heritage and its enhancement as a sustainable cultural-tourism product.

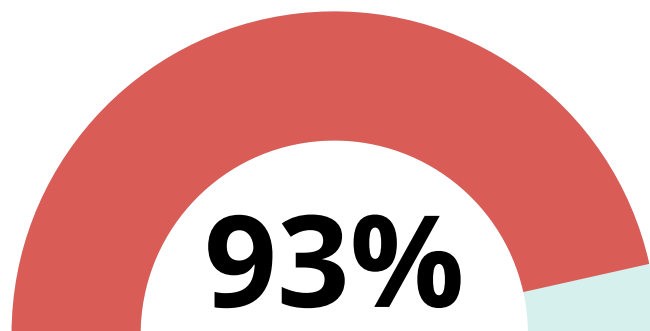
## MAIN PROJECT OBJECTIVES

The project aims to improve the use of tangible and intangible heritage through the upgrading of specific sites, further historical research on the First World War and diversification of tourism approaches. It also intends to develop multi-level and multi-sector governance to ensure long-term management and sustainability, strengthening the communication identity and promoting the route by involving visitors, institutions and residents.

## OUTPUT

On 26 October 2025, at the conclusion of the project, the trans-border open-air museum of Mount Ermada/Grmada was inaugurated. The event was preceded by two excursions for schools in Duino Aurisina/Devin Nabrežina and Komen and by an orienteering competition. Feasibility studies were also presented for the Italian side of Mount Sabotino and for transforming the Walk of Peace into a cycle-tourism route. Two stands for B2C events were created, and the “The Sounds of Peace” 2025 event was organised.

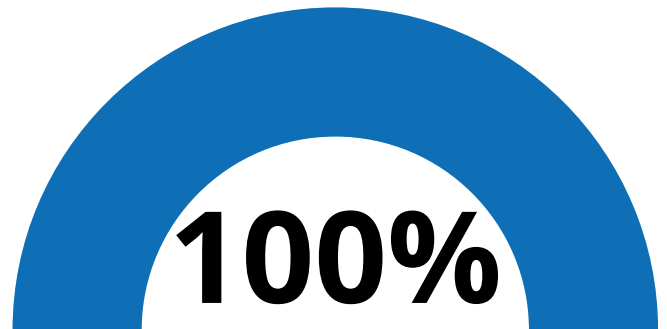
**MAIN PROJECT OBJECTIVES**

The general objective is to capitalise on and update the results of the NEX AID project in order to strengthen cross-border institutional cooperation by developing solutions to improve the management of health emergencies. The project aims to harmonise and raise the level of preparedness of medical personnel through a unified protocol and operational tools such as training activities and field simulations.

**OUTPUT**

The project was completed in October 2025 with full achievement of its objectives. Three cross-border protocols were developed and shared, and training activities were carried out which, over the two years of the project, involved operators from both countries according to a joint plan. Finally, in May 2025, a large-scale exercise was held in Socerb, which made it possible to verify the effectiveness of protocols, procedures and equipment.

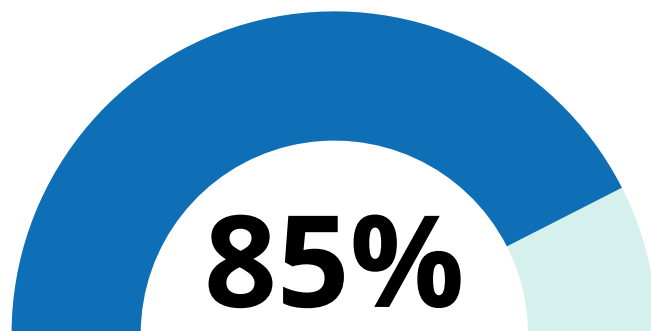

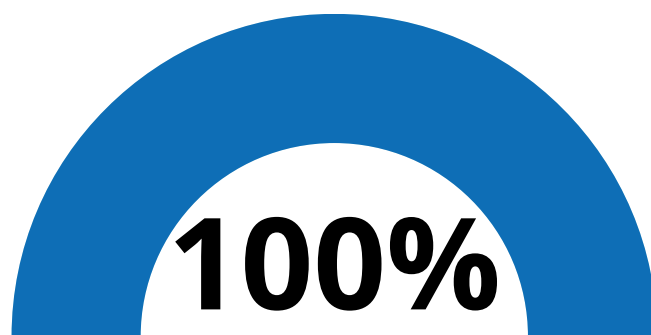
**MAIN PROJECT OBJECTIVES**

The project aims to develop shared strategies and strengthen the coordination of existing services to support a model of integrated and personalised care for older people and their families. The innovative approach includes the experimental promotion of dialogue leading to the establishment of cross-border Community Pacts, developed in synergy between public and private services and in collaboration with civil society and all formal and informal actors active in the territory.

**OUTPUT**

The bilingual Guidelines of the CrossCare® 2.0 Model and for the drafting of the Community Pacts have been prepared and disseminated. Five Community Pacts have been signed in Sacile, Portogruaro, Caorle, Trieste and in Slovenia, involving more than 50 entities including associations, local administrations and social and health services, and reaching around 400 older people through individual and group care projects. Through the workshops organised by the project, 228 social-health operators and more than 160 caregivers have been trained.

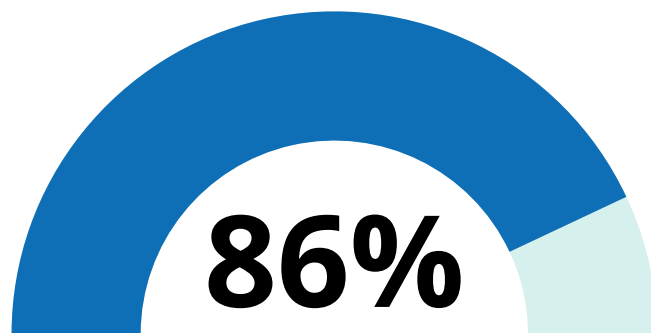
**MAIN PROJECT OBJECTIVES**

**OUTPUT**

The online publication of the Koper conference proceedings provides valuable guidance on addressing the challenges of multilingualism in public administration. The draft cross-border model for terminology standardization and the preliminary version of the terminology platform, comprising over 300 standardized legal and administrative terms, are designed to serve as practical tools for drafting documents and facilitating communication in the languages of the cross-border area.

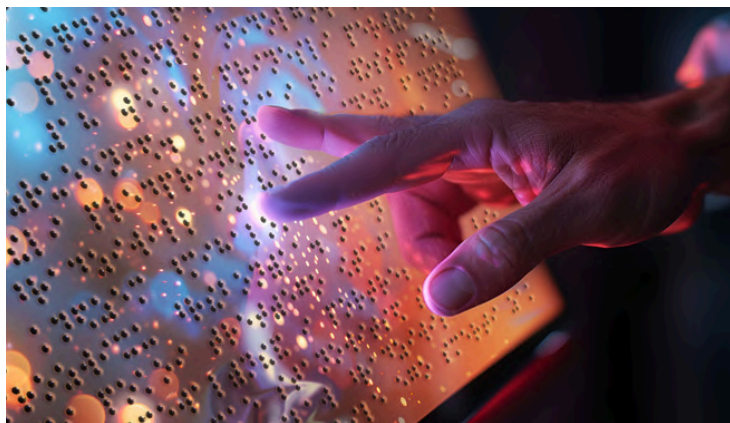

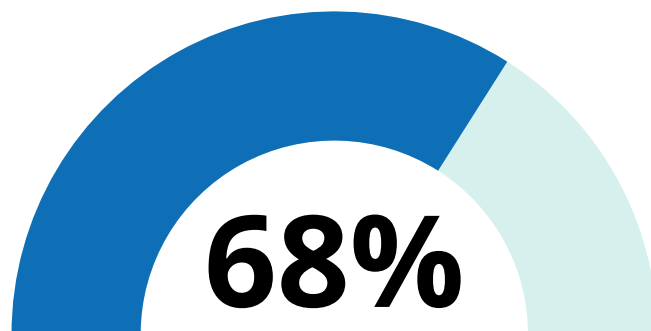
The DigARegion project addresses the lack of cross-border accessibility for vulnerable groups, in particular people with disabilities, blind people and deaf people. Although digitalisation is a necessary tool to improve access to information and services, it is not always consistent with accessibility requirements. DigARegion therefore aims to promote full and barrier-free accessibility, involving all people and taking into account the diversity and cultural identities of vulnerable groups.

By enhancing collaboration and involving local stakeholders in the process of building and strengthening competencies in digital accessibility, the project focuses on meeting the population's needs in terms of accessibility for vulnerable groups. To this end, an innovative digital platform will be created to promote and develop accessibility and cooperation in the region.

**OUTPUT**

**STATE OF ART**

The project is progressing towards the achievement of its objectives. The analysis of the legislation and approaches of the two countries has been completed, and guidelines and good practices for museums and for more general use have been drafted. The stakeholder database has been finalised and the technical infrastructure of the Cross-border Accessibility Portal is currently under development. The Support Point is operational and partners are preparing the training activities and the final conference.

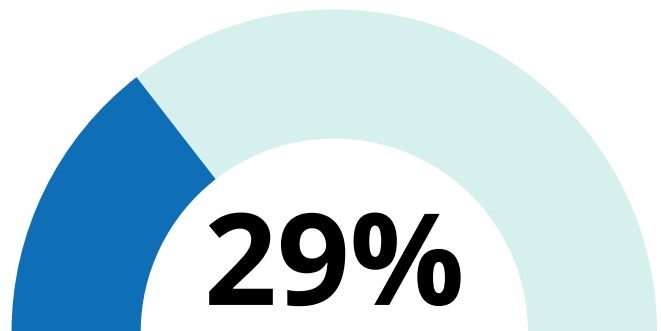

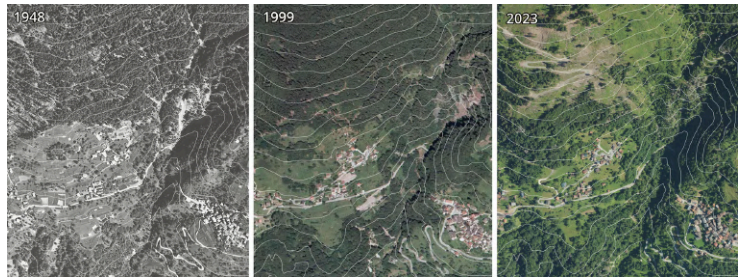

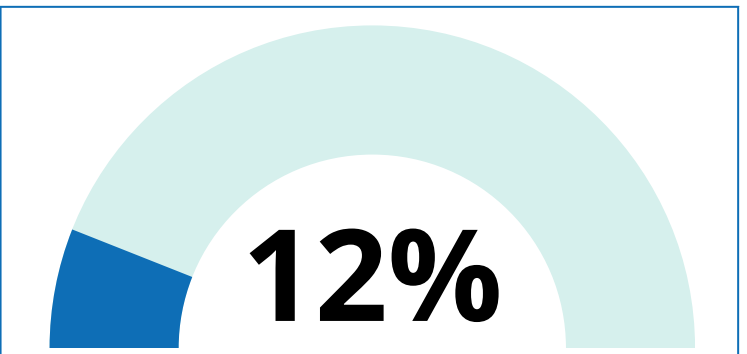

The objectives of the project are to develop climate-adaptation solutions that are specific, replicable and integrable into local planning; to prepare local proposals that reinforce regional and national strategies promoting fair and sustainable resilience; and to provide practical guidance enabling communities to implement adaptation actions tailored to their needs, compatible with the available human and economic resources and with existing strategies.

**OUTPUT**

**STATE OF ART**

The project is currently in the phase of collecting and organising baseline information. Partners are acquiring and reviewing data available from their respective climate agencies to identify a common set of indicators, as well as preparing questionnaires to gather the priorities of administrators, technicians and schools. The analysis of local stakeholders and their characteristics and needs also represents the starting point for preparing the guidelines.

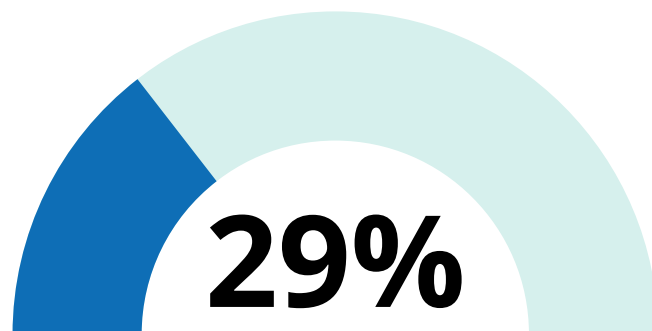
**MAIN PROJECT OBJECTIVES**

**MAIN PROJECT OBJECTIVES**

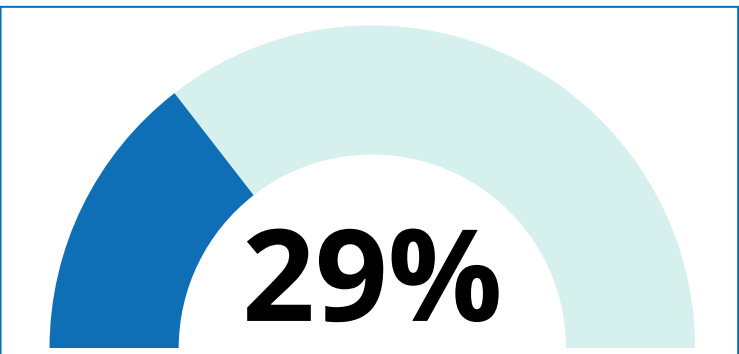

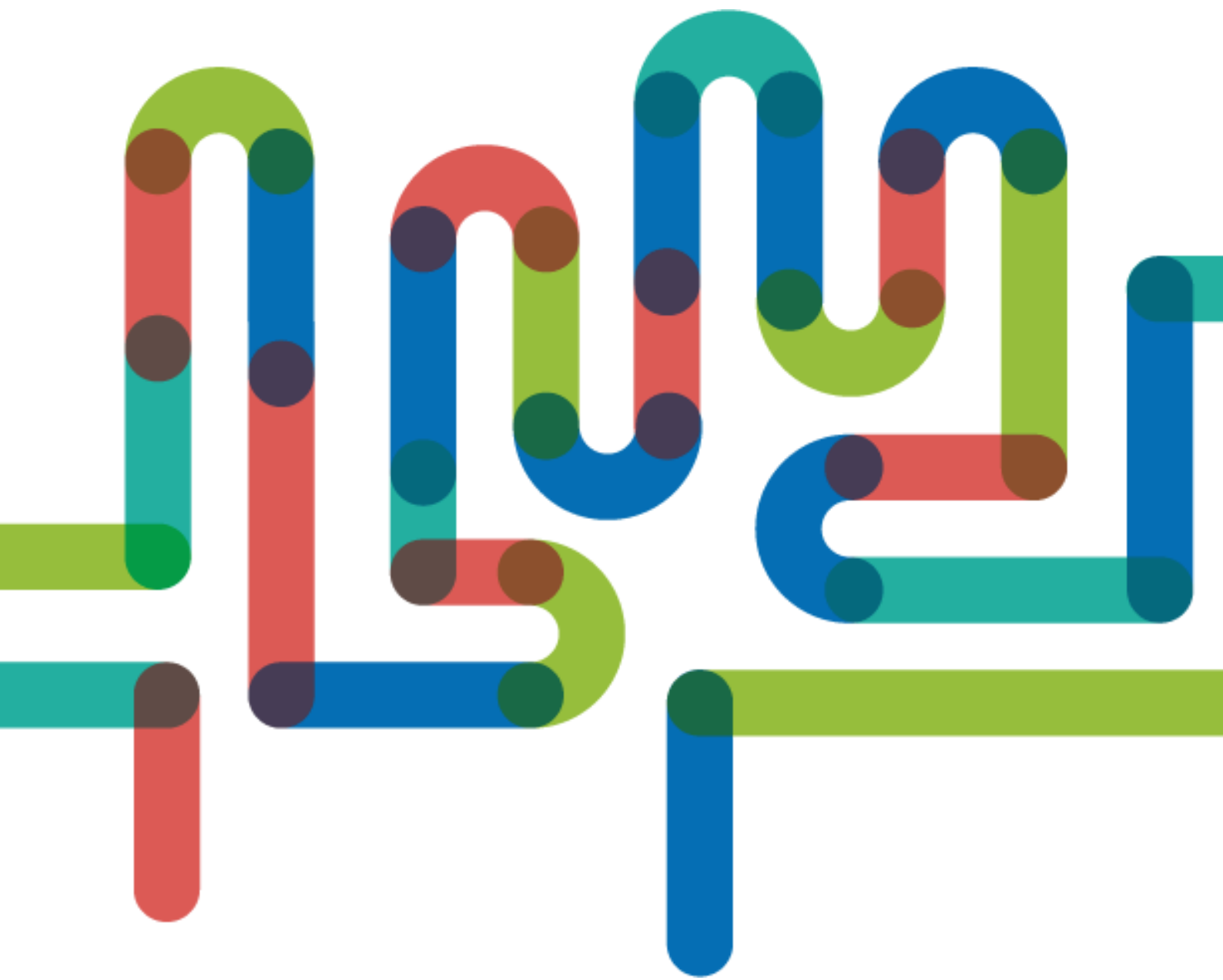
