

# Interreg VI-A Italy - Slovenia <u>Methodology Paper of the Performance</u> <u>Framework</u>

Rev. June 2023

### INTRODUCTION

This paper is dedicated to output and result indicators used in the Interreg Italy-Slovenia Programme, their definition and quantification. The methodology for the establishment of the performance framework of the Programme is set according to Article 17 (1) of CPR that requires to include: the criteria applied to select indicators; data or evidence used, quality assurance and the calculation method; factors that may influence the achievement of the milestones and targets and how they were taken into account. As for the methodology for selection and definition of relevant indicators, it was based on the European Commission's staff working document "Performance, monitoring and evaluation of the European Regional Development Fund, the Cohesion Fund and the Just Transition Fund in 2021-2027" (SWD(2021) 198 final).

The reasons of the revision are based on the following assumptions: firstly, the need to match all output indicators to a result indicator in order to grant the compliance to the intervention logic principle at Programme and project level; secondly the adjustment of estimated ERDF contribution for type(s) of projects in order to maximize the use of European fund on the territory.

### **INDICATORS' SELECTION**

The Interreg Italy-Slovenia has established an indicators system with respect to its intervention logic which is based on the territorial analysis (summarized in section 1.2 of the IP). The Programme's Task Force has selected 3 policy objectives and the Intrerreg Specific Objective (ISO1) and 7 relevant specific objectives (SO) to be addressed in the Programme linked to identified challenges and needs in the Programme area. Section 2 of the IP provides the information on selected specific objectives as well as the actions and examples of actions to be supported within them.

For each SO a set of at least one output and one result indicator and a matching for each output indicator to a result indicator has been established. In the 2021-2027 programming period output indicators will measure deliverables from the projects to be supported while result indicators will focus on the outcomes of funded projects for beneficiaries.

Main principles for indicators' selection by the Programme were:

- ✓ At least one result and one output indicator specific for Interreg Programme were chosen for each SO ensuring their relevance to Programme goals;
- ✓ To facilitate future monitoring, the number of indicators shall be limited, however, taking into consideration a good coverage of key outputs and results generated by projects;
- ✓ result indicators have been chosen in connection with output indicators;
- ✓ Indicators must be easily measurable to facilitate evaluation of the financed projects.

### INDICATOR SYSTEM FOLLOWING THE INTERVENTION LOGIC

The intervention logic of the Programme is built on the identified challenges stemming from the Territorial and socio-economic analysis. Following this logic, actions to be supported were based on the inputs from TSE analysis, lessons learnt from 2014-2020 programming period, TF inputs, institutional representatives' interviews, public consultations and scoping report. Accordingly, result indicators were chosen for each SO in order to measure the achievement of the desired change. Output indicators were linked to one or more exemplary actions in order to catch the main realisations of the projects. The indicators were chosen from a list of common output and result indicators for the ERDF for Interreg

Annex I of ERDF Regulation to ensure better capturing of the achievements of the financed projects. Further, the Programme has defined intervention fields with relative financial allocations for each specific objective. They were selected from the list provided in CPR considering the actions and exemplary actions to be supported. On the basis of the resources allocated, target and milestones have been quantified according to the methodology presented in the following pages.

Projects are expected to bring tangible results and will be measured using the system of output and result indicators.

### **Output indicators**

A set of 8 Interreg specific common output indicators and 1 ERDF output indicator has been defined, taking into account the actions to be supported by the Programme, ensuring their capability to capture expected projects' outputs. Therefore, the output indicators selected for the Programme are:

- RCO 81 Participations in joint actions across borders
- RCO 83 Strategies and action plans jointly developed
- RCO 84 Pilot actions developed jointly and implemented in projects
- RCO 85 Participations in joint training schemes
- RCO 87 Organisations cooperating across borders
- RCO 90 Projects for innovation networks across borders
- RCO 115 Public events across borders jointly organized
- RCO 116 Jointly developed solutions
- RCO 58 Dedicated cycling infrastructure supported

### **Result indicators**

As for the result indicators, a set of 5 Interreg specific common result indicators has been established, taking into account the actions and output indicators selected by the Programme:

- RCR 79 Joint strategies and action plans taken up by organisations
- RCR 84 Organisations cooperating across borders after project completion
- RCR 85 Participations in joint actions across borders after project completion
- RCR 104 Solutions taken up or up-scaled by organisations
- RCR 81 Completion of joint training schemes

In addition, 1 Programme specific indicator has been defined: Number of sites/tourist destinations with increased connectivity to cycle routes.

## **INDICATORS' QUANTIFICATION**

For each output indicator the milestones to be reached by the end of 2024 are calculated and for both output and result indicators the final targets to be reached by the end of 2029 are defined according to Article 16 of CPR.

As per definition of Article 2 of CPR:

- ✓ 'target' means a pre-agreed value to be achieved at the end of the programming period in relation to an indicator included under a specific objective;
- ✓ 'milestone' means an intermediate value to be achieved at a given point in time during the programming period in relation to an indicator included under a specific objective.

According to the European Commission's staff working document "Performance, monitoring and evaluation of the European Regional Development Fund, the Cohesion Fund and the Just Transition Fund in 2021-2027", baselines for indicators are normally not required and systematically considered as "zero". Milestones set for 2024 are required for all output indicators and where justified they may be set as "zero". Milestones will not be set for result indicators.

The calculation of milestones and targets is based on the following data and assumptions<sup>1</sup>:

- 1. financial allocation foreseen for each specific objective minus TA
- 2. estimated allocation ratio on standard and capitalisation projects within SOs (with the exception of ISO1(c) where only small projects are foreseen):
  - Standard projects 70%
  - Capitalisation projects 30%
- 3. Estimated ERDF contribution for type(s) of projects contributing to selected Indicator
  - 900.000,00 € for a standard project on PO1,
  - 850.000,00 for a standard project on PO2
  - 1.100.000,00 for a standard project on PO4
  - 700.000 € for a standard project on ISO1 (b)
  - 600.000 € for a capitalisation project
  - 3.500.000 € for each strategic project
  - 100.000 € for each small project on ISO1c

- 4. estimated number of projects to be supported and respective percentage of the projects to contribute to selected indicator
- 5. experience linked to similar indicators of the 2014-2020 programming period and generally number of outputs generated by projects
- 6. estimated percentage of organisations participating to more than one project in different axes, according to previous experience to avoid double counting
- 7. experience of the ECoC experts that will manage the SPF
- 8. experience of the experts working on the indicators' quantification

In order to establish the values of the 2024 milestones for output indicators, the following information on calls' timelines and projects' duration was taken into consideration:

YEAR 2022 - CALL FOR CAPITALISATION AND FIRST CALL FOR ECOC SPF

In order to accelerate the starting of the Programme and avoid delays at its beginning, a Call for capitalisation can be launched immediately in 2022. The Call for capitalisation will target standard projects 2014-2020 already closed and will be opened to PO1-PO2-PO4-ISO1. The goal shall be to have small projects up to 600.000€ ERDF with limited duration (up to 24 months).

Coming to ECoC, an annual call is foreseen starting from 2022. 2 types of projects are expected:

- > short projects with a maximum duration of twelve months and the budget within 30.000€ and 100.000€. These projects will be implemented mostly in year 2025.
- ▶ long projects that exceed the twelve months duration, but end within 24 months. The allocation up to 200.000€.
- YEAR 2023 FIRST CALL FOR STANDARD PROJECTS AND SECOND CALL FOR ECOC SPF

The first call for standard projects will be opened to PO1-PO2-PO4-ISO1 and it will follow the usual procedure and will have the standard requirements.

YEAR 2024 -CALL FOR SMALL SCALE PROJECTS/PEOPLE-TO-PEOPLE AND THIRD CALL FOR ECOC
 SPF

People-to-people cross-border initiatives implemented in the form of small-scale projects in the range of 30.000-100.000 € ERDF are expected and will be developed in 12 months. Considering that projects will be developed in short time, the dedicated call can be launched in 2024 giving priority in 2023 to the standard call only.

YEAR 2025 – SECOND CALL FOR STANDARD PROJECTS AND FOURTH CALL FOR ECOC SPF

Only the projects expected to end by 31 December 2024 will contribute to the achievement of the milestone and specifically the projects contracted through the capitalisation call to be launched in 2022.

# FACTORS THAT MAY INFLUENCE THE ACHIEVEMENT OF THE MILESTONES AND TARGETS

Although the Programme has determined the milestones and targets for the indicators relying on the previous experience, on expertise of the experts defining them and on prudent assumptions, there are indeed some external factors that may have an impact on their achievement.

First of all, due to the use of bottom-up approach used for calls, the final number of projects financed per each specific objective cannot be guaranteed even given that their estimated distribution is based

on the previous programming periods experience. There will be several measures taken in this regard, including the capitalisation call to be launched in 2022 accelerating the start of the programme and ensuring there are no delays to its implementation.

Furthermore, the situation with COVID-19 pandemic and the conflict in Ukraine and their impact on socio-economic challenges of territory is still hard to predict in long-term perspective. They may influence the economic and institutional capacities of potential beneficiaries and as a result have a negative impact on the achievement of the targets. Such an instability is especially challenging for private companies. The Italy-Slovenia Programme will observe the mentioned factors and be disposed to introduce additional mitigation measures such as thematically targeted calls.

### **DATA COLLECTION AND QUALITY ASSURANCE**

When drafting the methodological document, it was ensured that the data underpinning the indicator baselines, milestones, and targets were taken from a reliable source (e.g., the monitoring system or official statistics). Whenever this was not the case, the necessary steps were taken to ensure the quality of the data.

The procedure foreseen for the collection and quality assurance of the data related to output and result indicators is based mainly on the 2014-2020 programming period experience and lessons learnt. To obtain reliable data concerning achieving the targets set for output and result indicators, the beneficiaries will be given detailed and clear information about:

- the definitions provided by the European Commission's staff working document "Performance, monitoring and evaluation of the European Regional Development Fund, the Cohesion Fund and the Just Transition Fund in 2021-2027";
- the calculation method to be applied;
- the information to be used in order to prove the achievement of the target and to exclude double counting.

Data on indicator forecasts and progress are acquired at the project level via application forms and during regular project implementation monitoring through the periodic progress reports in the joint electronic monitoring system (JeMS). Thus, the Programme is involved in several coordination activities under the guidance of Interact (HIT core group, JeMS group, evaluation network) to minimize mistakes and implement an integrated approach within the Interreg community and enhance accuracy of the data gathered by JeMS. The JS will assess forecasts and achievements of targets on a regular basis. Firstly, throughout the pre-contracting phase, the JS verifies the expected values of outputs and results provided by the applicants, ensuring their coherence with Programme indicators and facilitating reporting. Furthermore, the MA/JS will support beneficiaries throughout the project's implementation by communicating with the lead partners on a regular basis, and implementing controls.

The lead partner is in charge of reporting of the relevant data collected from the project partners. The lead partner should seek to prevent double counting and to guarantee regularity of the partners' achievements while assessing and reporting their performance regarding indicators. Additionally, specifically for result indicators that must be measured within a particular time frame following project completion, the lead partner will need to ensure that the assessment is completed precisely and on time, and that the results are communicated to the MA/JS.
