# Showering Communities

### Roberto Ciambetti - President of the Veneto Region Council



Good morning to all from myself and from the Veneto Region, which I represent and which hosts the Managing Authority and the Joint Secretariat of the Interreg Italy-Croatia Programme. I begin first of all by thanking the **Friuli-Venezia Giulia Region**, which is hosting us here today, and with which we have a long history of institutional cooperation, certainly facilitated by the proximity of our territories. Let me also thank Director Sławomir Tokarski of the **European Commission**, for his participation and for the continuous support that his structure ensures to our territorial cooperation Programmes.

In this speech, I would like to talk to you about **three aspects**: the first concerns the **added value of Interreg** and the importance of supporting this instrument in the discussions on the future of cohesion policy; the second is related to the importance of **collaboration and synergies between funds**, and the case of the joint efforts between these two Interreg Programmes is a positive example of this collaboration; finally, the third is related to the theme that links the projects that are present today and which I feel very close for several reasons, namely **slow and sustainable tourism**.



Let me highlight how the current international situation and the challenges that the new European Commission will have to face force us to reflect on the importance and **centrality of Cohesion Policy**, which sees **European Territorial Cooperation** as one of its two objectives aiming at reducing disparities in the development between European regions, as set out in the Treaty. In view of the growing disparities between regions, and also within states themselves, also highlighted by the 9th Cohesion Policy Report, it is essential to continue investing in the harmonious development of territories and in the strategic orientation of investments starting from the real needs of each region.

Interreg is definitely the instrument that brings added value to cohesion, given by the cooperation between the organisations implementing the projects, by the challenges that institutions are able to face with joint answers to common problems, by the skills strengthened through the development of common projects, and by the ability of our territories to alleviate the administrative barriers and obstacles to cooperation that still persist.

As Veneto Region, we strongly believe in the added value of Interreg and, not only do we invest a lot in the active participation in all the 8 Programmes in which Veneto is involved but, as mentioned, we are in the forefront in the implementation of the Italy-Croatia Programme, with the role of Managing Authority.

As it is well known, the European Commission is expected to present its proposals for the **period 2028-2035** in the spring of 2025, thus opening up the three-year negotiation period in which, in addition to the current political challenges, the new features introduced with the 'Next Generation EU' plan will probably have to be taken into account. Also relevant in this context are the new priorities, such as the strengthening of European defence and the enlargement of the EU to the East, which are part of the recurring debate between competitiveness and solidarity within the EU.



With respect to Interreg and the **Post-2027 perspective**, as Veneto Region we firmly believe in the importance of ensuring the continuity of Interreg Programmes for the added value of relations, exchange and innovation that they bring to the territories, as well as for the relevance of the results achieved by the partner organisations involved and the interest to continue the collaboration with other countries demonstrated by the beneficiaries.

It will therefore be our endeavour to convey the relevance of Interreg to consolidate cohesion between the Union's territories through cooperation Programmes and the need for these Programmes to be maintained, if not strengthened, in the 2028-35 programming period.



Then, with respect to the advantages of **multi-level cooperation** (between the beneficiaries of the projects financed but also between the Managing Authorities and the Joint Secretariats of different Programmes), I believe that investing in synergies and complementarities between funds is a further element that increases the added value and impact of each Programme operating in neighbouring geographical areas. Today's meeting is a relevant example of synergies at different levels; likewise, the joint commitment of the Regional Administrations present here today to support the European Commission in the organisation of the Gorizia/Nova Gorica 'Interreg GO' event next year goes in the same direction. Let me also mention a further example of synergies on a subject that I feel is very close to me. The two Interreg programmes have selected and financed two projects 'Adrioncycletour' and 'CYROS': both contribute to the realisation of an EUSAIR flagship initiative aimed at developing the ADRIATIC-IONIC CYCLE ROAD that runs along the coast of all the EUSAIR countries from Italy to Greece and the cycle connections with the inland areas of these countries. Sharing an objective, in line with the Adriatic-Ionian macro-regional Strategy, I believe it is a very concrete and effective way to achieve tangible and visible results on the territory and only territorial cooperation can help us build initiatives such as this.



Finally, I would like to close with a brief reflection on the theme that unites the projects financed by the two Programmes and whose representatives are with us today. **Sustainable tourism and the preservation of our cultural and natural heritage** are central aspects in the definition of effective policies by our regions. It is indeed essential to balance the needs of local communities, businesses and travellers in order to allow everyone to experience tourist destinations and cities of artistic interest, avoiding their depopulation and at the same time promoting the rediscovery of rural communities and the deseasonalisation of tourist flows.

If, as proposed by the two projects referred to above, we succeed in promoting sustainable tourism through slow and green mobility itineraries and products, I think everyone can gain a real advantage and contribute to the development of our regions, safeguarding the environment, health and enhancing the wealth of the territories.
