Objectives

Reducing water consumption in <u>Rainbow</u> Trout farming (Recirculating Aquaculture Systems);

Applying <u>circular</u> economy to sludge and waste to produce energy or new biomass and to recover nitrogen and phosphorous;

Aquaculture systems digitalization and automation;

Creating new interdisciplinary professional figures and support life-long learning;

Innovation in farming practices is crucial because of climate change and its effects on the world around us!

















Recirculating Aquaculture System

Indoor RAS systems allows to rear the fish in a high controlled environment where the use of water can be minimized by reusing it after its physical and biological treatments.

Indoor RAS can mitigate the risk of outdoor aquaculture (natural disaster, pollution, and disease) and allow for optimized fish growth on a year-round basis.


















Recirculating Aquaculture System

Outdoor aquaculture can be partially converted in RAS systems to mitigate water requirements, especially during critical climate conditions.

RAS technology offer great opportunity in a climate change scenario also for fish welfare.



















Digital Twin

A Digital Twin is in essence a digital representation of a system that provides better insight into its dynamics.

It combines the knowledge of the real system through mathematical models with online data acquired from sensors and instruments deployed in or at the physical system.






















One Health

One Health is an integrated, unifying approach that aims to sustainably balance and optimize the health of people, animals and ecosystems.


















Circular Economy

Is a model of production and consumption based on reducing, reusing or recycling resources.

The waste produced from a production chain can represent a "resource" for another chain.

CircularRainbow meet this vision by first optimizing the water use by its recirculation and by repurposing the sludge into energy or novel biomass for the agro-industrial chain.

















Next Generation Trout Farmers

The future aqua farmers use new technologies to know and monitor their farm environment and production through sensor for real time data collection.

The real time biotic and abiotic monitoring will ensure fish welfare and thus product quality.

















Insect Farmers

Insect farmers know entomology to rise and breed insect as mini livestock.

Insect farmers have a key role in circular economy and can connect different agro-industrial chains.

For example, insect can upcycle the waste to produce eco-friendly fertilizers or bio-convert co-products to obtain biomolecules and alternative proteins for animal feed.

















Biomass Energy Engineers

Fish sludge is valuable biomass that can be transformed in biofuel.

The Biomass energy engineer is expert in chemistry and microbiology and can convert complex substances in high quality green fuels.

This contributes to reducing energy consumption of fish farms and their carbon footprint.




Bio-systems Modelists

Bio-systems modelist have data analysis skills and biology knowledge.

They know how to extract meaningful information from data and use them to predict the future with simulations.

Their aim is to create a digital twin of the fish farm to optimize its management practice, fish welfare while reducing energy consumptions.

















Science Communication Experts

Communication experts represent a key link between scientists and citizens, with the aim to easily explain how the scientific progresses can be exploited.

They know that a food product success is based on transparency in production methods.

The consumers should be aware of the value in the circular foods production system approach, as well as fish farmers should know the novel opportunities from a circular approach.


















Closing the loop, opening a world of possibilities



THE BEGINNING

From an idea of the Fundacija Pot Miru v Posočju of Kobarid which in turn takes up the idea of Walter Schaumann and the Dolomitenfreunde Association (Austria).

To connect all the point of interest of the Great War of the austro-Italian front to create a Path of Peace.

"Paths which were once divided by WWI frontlines (Kingdom of Italy and Austro-Hungarian Monarchy) shall bring us together today."

(prof. Walther Schaumann, 1973)




















THE BEGINNING

In the early years (around 2000-2005) the first routes connected some open-air museums and places of the Great War in the area of the Upper Soča Valley (in the Municipalities between Bovec, Kobarid and Tolmin)

This idea spread to other Slovenian municipalities up to the area of Nova Gorica (Sabotin/Sabotino) and Karst area.

At the same time, the Friuli Venezia Giulia Region began working as lead partner on the Interregional project «Itineraries of the Great War - a journey through history» together with Veneto, Lombardy and the provinces of Trento and Bolzano.





















Around 2012 FVG and Slovenia started to work together for the Centenary of the WWI.

Why?

The front of Isonzo (the most important part of Italian front) today is in Slovenia and Italy.

Kobarid (in italian Caporetto) is for the Italian history a symbol of the Italian Great War

At the same time, the memories of part of the families in Friuli Venezia Giulia are strictly connected with the «austro-hungarian heritage».





















POT MIRU AND WALK OF PEACE

The first Interreg project on the ITA-SLO program has been "Pot Miru – Via di Pace" (2013-2015)

The second one has been the strategic project "Walk of Peace" (2018-2022)























- 500 km route from Log Pod Mangartom to Trieste (Molo Audace)
- It crosses the areas of western Slovenia and Friuli Venezia Giulia that were part of the Isonzo front of the First World War, including the rear
- Divided into 25 stages (12 in Friuli Venezia Giulia and 13 in Slovenia) + 5 extra stages (in Slovenia)
- Designed on CAI paths and secondary ordinary roads
- It is a journey to be made strictly on foot
- Along the Walk of Peace there are two rings themed on both a historical and naturalistic level: the Kobarid-Cividale-Kobarid ring and the Nova Gorica/Gorizia-Malchina ring

WALK OF PEACE + PROJECT

Yhe main goal: to capitalise the important result of the previous WALKofPeace project - voted the best INTERREG 2020 project - which had created the WoP "brand" connecting more than 300 monuments in a pathway more than 500 kilometres long

The project aims to:

Improve accessibility to the tangible and intangible heritage of the Great War by transferring the best practice acquired on Mount Sabotino/Sabotin to improve the usability of the peak of Mount Hermada/Grmada;

Create a multi-level and multi-sectoral cross-border governance for the management of the "brand" in the long term by involving all stakeholders in a process of defining a cross-border strategy and action plan;

Strengthen the Cross-border Tourism Promotion Strategy in order to make the WoP product a "brand" capable of catalysing the attention of the public attentive to a cultural, slow and sustainable form of tourism.








What is IVY?


























My IVY Experience – A Journey of Growth & Impact








Why Youth Councils?



Our EUSAIR Journey

- Key Milestones Leading to the Establishment:
- April 2024: A call for applications was launched to select young representatives aged 18 to 29 from the Adriatic-Ionian region to form the Youth Council.
- November 2024: The inaugural meeting took place in Dubrovnik, marking the official establishment of the EUSAIR Youth Council.















Objectives of the Macro-regional Strategy for the Adriatic and Ionian Region Youth Council:

- Youth Participation: Involve young people in decision-making.
- Policy Influence: Ensure youth perspectives shape regional policies.
- Regional Cooperation: Connect young leaders across the Adriatic-Ionian region.
- **Sustainability:** Advocate for eco-friendly and long-term regional solutions.
