



- Small is good

### HOW TO **MAXIMISE THE IMPACT** OF PROJECTS?

- The bike approach (mid-term support)
- Stronger institutional commitment (especially at local level)
- Improve projects exit strategies
- Adopt a shared governance model (multi-level)



### HOW CAN **RESULTS BE BETTER CAPITALISED?**

- Horizontal capitalisation
- Use of shared tools
- Meet the expectations
- Advocate for a mid-long terms vision

## PART 3 - SYNERGIES, MAINSTREAM AND BROADER PARTICIPATION



### HOW TO IMPROVE SYNERGIES AND EMBEDDING WITH REGIONAL, NATIONAL STRATEGIES OR MAINSTREAM PROGRAMMES?

- Embed into local policies
- Aim at connections that are human centered and actors oriented
- Peer reviews intended to stress processes instead of results
- Cooperation model as an alternative even within the entities involved



### SUGGESTIONS TO BETTER INCLUDE YOUTH AND CITIZENS

- Stress the role of local authorities as facilitators
- Encourage people to have a say
- Engage youth in performing cooperation
- Engage tourist to become temporary residents and reciprocate
