



State of the art of projects co-financed by Interreg VI-A Italy-Slovenia 2021-2027 Programme

December 2024













This publication presents the state of the art of the projects co-financed by Interreg VI-A Italy-Slovenia 2021-2027 Programme until December 2024.

There are 3 operations of strategic importance, 25 capitalization projects, 29 standard projects and 56 small scale projects, co-financed by the Small Projects Fund (SPF), implemented within the framework of the EGTC GO/EZTS GO cross-border area between the municipalities of Gorizia, Nova Gorica and Šempeter-Vrtojba.

Two Monitoring Committees of the Interreg VI-A Italy-Slovenia Programme 2021-2027 were held in 2024. The first Monitoring Committee met in March in Cividale del Friuli and approved the ranking list of the project proposals submitted within the Call for standard projects No. 02/2023. During the second Monitoring Committee, held in October 2024 in Venice, the Call for Standard Projects No. 03/2024 was approved.

The call for standard projects No. 03/2024 makes available over 10 million euros to fund cross-border projects in order to prevent and combat risks related to climate and environmental change. The call was presented to beneficiaries in Trieste, Koper and Venice.

The Interreg VI-A Italy-Slovenia Programme was also present at the European Week of Regions and Cities in Brussels in October. On this occasion, the pilot project CROssingITA-SLOwly, which is the result of the cooperation between the Interreg Italy-Slovenia and Interreg Italy-Croatia programmes, was launched. This is the very first cooperation of this kind between Interreg programmes.

This publication describes all the projects financed by the Programme, divided by Policy Objectives.

Each project is described in a fact sheet, which provides an overview of:

- budget and duration;
- project summary and objectives to be achieved;
- current status of project implementation as of December 2024;
- details on Project Partners and Associated Partners (if any).





THE INTERREG VI-A ITALY-SLOVENIA 2021-2027 PROGRAMME

The Interreg VI-A Italy-Slovenia 2021-2027 Programme was approved by the European Commission with the execution decision C(2022) 5745 of August 3rd 2022.

The Programme covers the seven-year European programming period 2021-2027 and is developed with a view of continuity and capitalisation with what was achieved in the previous period 2014-2020, which financed 63 projects in the fields of competitiveness, research and innovation, protection and enhancement of cultural and natural resources and cross-border services.

With a budget of just over 88.6 million euro, the Interreg VI-A Italy-Slovenia 2021-2027 Programme bases its strategy on the following Policy objectives:

- 1) a more competitive, innovative and intelligent Europe (Policy Objective PO 1),
- 2) a greener Europe towards a zero net carbon economy (Policy Objective PO 2)
- 3) a more social and inclusive Europe (Policy Objective PO 4)
- 4) a better governance of cooperation (Interreg Specific Objective ISO 1).

These objectives are broken down into Specific Objectives.

Institutional Programme Partners

The Programme involves two European Union Member States. Institutional partners are the Republic of Italy, which participates with the Friuli Venezia Giulia Autonomous Region and the Veneto Region, and the Republic of Slovenia, which participates with the Vzhodna Slovenija and the Zahodna Slovenija regions.





Programme Area

The area covered by the Interreg VI-A Italy-Slovenia Programme extends over an area of 19,841 km² with a total population of approximately 3 million inhabitants.

At the NUTS 2 level, the Programme area therefore involves 2 Italian regions, Veneto and Friuli Venezia Giulia, and 2 Slovenian regions, Vzhodna Slovenija and Zahodna Slovenija.

The Programme area comprises 10 territorial units at NUTS3 level, of which 5 on the Italian side, i.e., for the Autonomous Region of Friuli Venezia Giulia, the former provinces of Udine, Pordenone, Gorizia and Trieste and for the Veneto Region the metropolitan city of Venice (former province of Venice) only, and 5 on the Slovenian side with the statistical regions Primorsko-notranjska, Osrednjeslovenska, Gorenjska, Obalno-kraška and Goriška.

The cooperation area encompasses various spatial development models. A particular example is represented by the functional area between the municipalities of Gorizia (IT), Nova Gorica and Šempeter-Vrtojba (SLO), where a European Grouping of Territorial Cooperation (EGTC for short) - the most advanced form of cross-border territorial cooperation at European level - has been operating since 2011. Its objective is to incentivise a shared governance in the health sector as well as modernisation and innovation in the fields of environment, infrastructure, urban transport, logistics, energy and economic development.

The Programme area, which is highly heterogeneous in geographical terms, includes coastal areas, mountain ranges, rural and urban areas (Triest, Udine, Gorizia, Nova Gorica, Ljubljana, Pordenone, Venice, Koper, Izola, Piran, Kranj and Postojna) and Iagoon areas.

Budget and Policy Objectives

The Programme's financial plan amounts to a total of €88,623,329.00, of which €70,898,662.00 is provided by the ERDF and €17,724,667.00 by national co-financing.

From the total endowment of the Programme, an overall percentage of 7% will be deducted to be allocated for Technical Assistance which, unlike in previous Programmes. Therefore, the ERDF allocation available for projects actually amounts to a total of €66,260,431.00.

As for the ERDF co-financing rate for projects is 80%. For Slovenian project partners, each beneficiary has to provide the remaining 20% from its own resources. For all Italian partners the remaining 20% is covered by the Rotation Fund for Development and Cohesion.

The budget supports four Policy Objectives and Technical Assistance:



Policy Objective 1: A more competitive and smarter Europe by promoting innovative and smart economic transformation and regional ICT connectivity



Policy Objective 2: A greener, low-carbon transitioning towards a net zero carbon economy and resilient Europe by promoting clean and fair energy transition, green and blue investment, the circular economy, climate change mitigation and adaptation and risk prevention and management





Challenges and expected results

- Challenges are: mitigate the negative effects of the pandemic on the cross-border economy, enhance innovation capacity, industrial research, business digitization, and simplify the administrative side.
- Expected results are: to develop technological solutions aimed at fostering the inclusion of older and vulnerable people; to provide social and health services through technological solutions (e.g., telemedicine); to improve technology transfer to SMEs; to strengthen cooperation between research and innovation centres and businesses by increasing the continuity of investment in R&D and applied research; to reduce development disparities through social innovation; to capitalize on the best practices achieved and to strengthen the diffusion of ICT, through which we also want to improve bilingual services to citizens and businesses.

Under Policy Objective 1, 4 capitalisation projects and 5 standard projects are cofinanced.

PROJECT SUMMARY



The AI-GRAPE project brings together partners from Slovenia and Italy with the aim to develop a decision support system based on artificial intelligence, which will utilize advanced technologies and data to enable sustainable grape production and vineyard protection.

MAIN PROJECT OBJECTIVES

The Al-GRAPE project aims to develop a decision support system based on Al, using data from weather stations, sensors, drones, and insect traps. It promotes sustainable viticulture through Al-driven data analysis. The project's key innovation is integrating various data sources to create predictive models. Advanced technologies like machine learning and big data analysis enable early detection of pests and diseases, allowing vineyard managers to take swift, targeted actions.

OUTPUT

Technical equipment for advanced monitoring has been purchased and presented, including automatic pest traps, weather stations, and drones with multispectral cameras. Test areas have been defined in vineyards in Slovenia and Italy, where monitoring will take place. Technical specifications for predictive models have been prepared, which will use artificial intelligence to enable precise pest development monitoring and optimization of intervention measures.



PROJECT SUMMARY



ALL-MICRO is an advanced optical and electron microscopy network operating in the Italian-Slovenian border region. It unites universities (Trieste, Nova Gorica), research centers (Nanocenter, CNR-IOM), and tech hubs (PTP, Tec4i) to support public and private entities in accessing cutting-edge microscopy techniques. The network bridges academia, research, and industry, offering scientific expertise, high-end instrumentation, and services like SEM, TEM, AFM, and Raman microscopy to foster technological innovation and competitiveness.

MAIN PROJECT OBJECTIVES

The primary goal of ALL-MICRO is to allow access to advanced optical and electron microscopy techniques, facilitating their application in research, industry, and services. By raising awareness of recent technological innovations and offering proof-of-concept experiments and collaborations, the network aims to bridge the gap between academia and industry, enhance technological capabilities, and strengthen the competitiveness of the Italian-Slovenian border region and beyond.

OUTPUT

After the Kick-off in April where timelines, monthly meetings were defined. A committee of 10 experts was appointed to evaluate proposals from industrial users. A training event was held, and partners were assigned specific tasks. The project's deliverables include meeting minutes, newsletters, a webinar and a network presentation, which aimed at promoting the project's work.

PROJECT SUMMARY



The project aims to enhance innovation and competitiveness in the Italian-Slovenian agri-food sector through biotechnology and public-private collaboration. Objectives include improving processes, creating new products and businesses, boosting efficiency, supporting local economies, and reducing resource use. Beneficiaries include agri-food, nutraceutical, and cosmetics companies, research centers, and local communities from both sides of the border.

MAIN PROJECT OBJECTIVES

Adding value to the Italian-Slovene agri-food supply chains through the transfer of biotechnology solutions, promoting collaboration between the public and private sectors. Innovations focus on the use of biotechnology to optimize agri-food processes and develop new products, with benefits such as increased production efficiency, stimulating local economies, and greater environmental sustainability. Facilitating the exchange of knowledge and best practices.

OUTPUT

The project partners outlined the goals and activities in May and June 2024 and presented the project to a broader audience. As part of the first phase of the work project, the methodology for data collection was completed, the mapping of small and medium-sized enterprises (SMEs) began, and a draft report on quality management and evaluation was prepared, including fieldwork during three online meetings.

POLICY OBJECTIVEPOLICY OBJECTIVE: PO1

SPECIFIC OBJECTIVE: SO1

TYPOLOGY: STANDARD PROJECT

The project aims to develop an open platform to guide researchers in regulatory compliance and facilitate the introduction of advanced therapies in the Italy-Slovenia area. Through a pilot action based on a clinical study for the treatment of difficult wounds, the project will test the platform's effectiveness. The aim is to improve access to innovative treatments, optimize cross-border regulatory pathways and incentivize collaboration among research centers, hospitals, and businesses.

MAIN PROJECT OBJECTIVES

The main objective of the COHERENCE project is to develop a cross-border platform to guide regulatory compliance in the field of advanced therapies and facilitate collaboration among research centers, hospitals, and businesses. The project will initiate a pilot clinical study for the treatment of difficult wounds, accelerate biomedical innovation and improve access to innovative treatments.

OUTPUT

The project staterd to develop a cross-border platform to facilitate the introduction of advanced therapies in clinical practice in Italy and Slovenia. Specifically, the activity involves the analysis and mapping of regulations for advanced biological therapies. To this date the regulation regarding the implementation of hospital exemption has been examined, with particular focus on identifying similarities and differences between Italian and Slovenian regulations.

POLICY OBJECTIVE: PO1 SPECIFIC OBJECTIVE: SC1

TYPOLOGY: CAPITALISATION

PROJECT

Rare pediatric immune-mediated diseases in the Program Area may have different diagnostic and therapeutic approaches. The main pediatric hospitals in the region adopt various strategies and tools, but thanks to the CONCERTO project and network of hospitals, research centers, and SMEs, it has been possible to harmonize the clinical and therapeutic practices of the two main centers. In addition, feasibility studies for new diagnostic tests have been developed.

MAIN PROJECT OBJECTIVES

The CONCERTO project 'CrossbOrder Network for ChildrEn RheumaTolOgy' aims to enhance, transfer and disseminate some of the deliverables produced by the CATTEDRA project. CONCERTO intends to further develop the jointly constructed database of patients suffering from rare immune-mediated diseases affecting children in the programme area. The second objective of the project is to capitalise on a feasibility study of diagnostic tests for rare diseases in children.

OUTPUT

Halfway through the project, improvements were identified for the joint database to make it more comprehensive in terms of data and easier to use, particularly for data upload and for downloading anonymized patient data, which can be selected according to different criteria for research purposes. At the same time, a roadmap was defined to enhance the diagnostic tests developed in CATTEDRA through the introduction of biosensors.

PROJECT SUMMARY



The IMUNOCLUSTER-2 project supports cross-border cooperation to improve the quality of life of residents. The overall goal of the project is to start a clinical trial of a cell vaccine (aHyC) for the treatment of breast cancer at an interregional level on both sides of the border. The project promotes innovation and technology transfer of SMEs, strengthens cooperation between companies, research and healthcare institutions, and enables the capitalization of the results achieved in the previous Immuno-Cluster project.

MAIN PROJECT OBJECTIVES

The main goal of the project is to start a clinical trial of a cell vaccine (aHyC) for the treatment of breast cancer at an interregional level and to make this advanced treatment accessible to patients on both sides of the border.

OUTPUT

The project has prepared a protocol for the clinical trial and the preparation and quality standards for the aHyC cell vaccine used as treatment of triple-negative breast cancer (TNBC). The application form for the clinical study of aHyC is being updated and will be submitted to the Ethics Committee and at the Medicines Agency. While waiting on the approval of the application, the project is carrying out the necessary preparations for the recruitment of patients and the start of the clinical trial.

PROJECT SUMMARY



PRO-SIS is the capitalization project of the project CONSTRAIN, which worked on the effectiveness of intervention strategies to reduce the seismic vulnerability of existing masonry buildings, based on the use of fiber-based composite materials. The interventions focused on one side only of the walls, to avoid relocating occupants and to allow the preservation of protected facades. PRO-SIS focuses on design strategies for these interventions, to be used in professional practice.

MAIN PROJECT OBJECTIVES

The main objective is the development of analytical correlations for a reliable design of intervention, with the definition of numerical procedures to be used in common commercial softwares so to account for the effects of intervention. The project will test the applicability to case-study buildings (one of public housing, one protected by cultural heritage), and draft guidelines concerning the design and application procedures.

OUTPUT

Sophisticated numerical simulations have been performed to analyse the role of reinforcement in different wall configurations and to optimize design methods. Simplified numerical analyses are being carried out using commercial software, to calibrate the reinforcement procedures. Surveys and data collection of the case studies have been completed, and simplified numerical models are being developed to study the seismic vulnerability before and after the intervention.



PROJECT SUMMARY



The T4RAIL IT-SI project aims to solve language barriers to railway interoperability through the operational testing of the Translate4rail automatic translator used in the exchange of communication between the driver and the traffic controller. T4RAIL IT-SI promotes territorial cooperation in Europe and envisages the participation of Italian and Slovenian partners.

MAIN PROJECT OBJECTIVES

The main objective of T4RAIL IT-SI is to promote technological innovation and digitalisation of the railway sector to improve cross-border railway connections between Italy and Slovenia, and to make local companies more competitive and sustainable.

OUTPUT

The first phase of the project involved the examination of European and national operating standards and the coding of communications into predefined messages, which feed the database of the automatic translation software Translate4rail. Currently the start of risk analysis activities for the practical testing of Translate4rail is underway. The universities conducted surveys to assess the potential impacts of the project on modal shift and employment.

X-BRAIN.net is the capitalization project of MEMORI-net, and focuses on accelerating the rehabilitation process for stroke patients. Researchers from different project partners are investigating the impact of physical inactivity during the early stages of post-stroke rehabilitation and assessing innovative protocols to mitigate its effects. As part of the project, active rooms have been developed within the neurology departments of SB Izola and Ospedale di Cattinara, featuring state-of-the-art technologies designed to optimize the rehabilitation process.

MAIN PROJECT OBJECTIVES

The X-BRAIN.net project aims to adapt bilingual, cross-border neurocognitive and physical protocols from MEMORI-net to meet the needs of stroke patients. The goal is to develop innovative rehabilitation solutions for the cross-border region, including the design of active rooms, the development of advanced clinical protocols, and training programs for healthcare professionals.

OUTPUT

A clinical study on the effects of 10 days of physical inactivity in the target population was completed, validating preventive protocols. All measurements for the second study, focused on early post-stroke rehabilitation protocols, were also completed. The results confirm successful protocol implementation, with positive feedback from patients and physiotherapists, who consider it a valuable addition to traditional rehabilitation, significantly boosting patient motivation.

OUTPUT

In the first year of the BeBlue project, pilot systems at the universities of Venice (UNIVE) and Ljubljana (UNILJU) were digitized to monitor energy, water consumption, and environmental quality. New products, such as marine fish, samphire, and macroalgae, were developed, and aquaponics was promoted through public events. A tool is being developed to calculate the carbon and water footprint, along with a preliminary economic assessment to support investments in aquaponics.

In the coastal areas of the Northern Adriatic, the extensive biodiversity represents a strategic asset for local economies. However, in recent years these areas are facing a growing environmental emergency: the invasion of the blue crab, a particularly aggressive alien species that is putting local biodiversity and human activities linked to the sea at risk. The project will develop a set of studies and solutions to face the challenge in a process of dissemination of knowledge and mutual coordination between Italy and Slovenia to deal with the emergency.

MAIN PROJECT OBJECTIVES

BLUECRAB protects the Northern Adriatic from the invasiveness of the blue crab through a monitoring and sustainable management system, involving institutions, fishers, and local communities. The project safeguards marine biodiversity and supports fishing with an innovative monitoring system and selective fishing practices to mitigate harmful effects. BLUECRAB also plans the creation of a permanent observatory for scientific and economic studies.

OUTPUT

In the first phase of the project, fishermen were asked to answer a questionnaire on the effects and issues related to the blue crab. Their early involvement, even during specific events, was crucial. Scientific partners are analysing the biological characteristics of the species and its habitat, while the economic analysis of supply chains has started. Selective fishing has begun in 4 target areas (Marano, Caorle, Cavallino Treporti - Venice, and Chioggia), with gear and probes already positioned.

Thanks to the initial field analysis, it will be possible to intervene on the deep-rooted motivations that prevent the adoption of virtuous practices, thus ensuring a paradigm shift.

OUTPUT

The first year is entirely dedicated to the analysis of best practices and disruptive innovations in the sector, including those based on artificial intelligence. The project will also study the Italian and Slovenian construction waste management legislation, for which initial analyses have been completed and a comparative study will be launched. Additionally, field analysis has been conducted, with questionnaires published for quantitative analysis.

Supported by cross-border cooperation, the project aims to optimize resources, digitalize processes, and disseminate new sustainable models aligned with the Green Deal and the Blue Economy strategies.

MAIN PROJECT OBJECTIVES

The project promotes the transition of trout farming toward circular models by adopting digitalized RAS systems to reduce water dependency, recover resources from waste, and improve efficiency and animal welfare. It aims to strengthen agro-food self-sufficiency by training qualified personnel, promoting sustainable practices, and raising awareness among producers and consumers to contribute to the sector's economic and environmental sustainability.

OUTPUT

Launched in April 2024 with a conference, the project conducted an in-depth analysis of production systems in the target area. Pilot plant upgrades and activities to assess energy recovery from effluents have started. The project also plans to develop an ecosystem services atlas and to inform the public through events and lectures on these topics.

A biodiversity evening was held, together with several events for students, professionals, and the scientific community. Promotional materials, including leaflets and posters, supported these activities.

The main objective of the project is setting up an expert group and preparing a cross-border action plan for the implementation of prevention and rehabilitation measures in non-urban areas, which are threatened or already affected by erosion. This will reduce the risks to local populations and strengthen resilience for the effects of climate change.

OUTPUT

Following the kick-off meeting and public outreach, technical work was initiated. National (ITA/SLO) and EU legislation, along with erosion assessment methods, were reviewed. Two expert excursions were conducted to showcase best practices in erosion remediation. Field visits for pilot activities and the preparation of an action plan for erosion prevention and mitigation were also undertaken.

IRRIGAVIT aims to strengthen the resilience of cross-border viticulture with sustainable protocols for water and soil management. The results of the previous Acquavitis project will be capitalized by transferring innovative technologies and protocols tested in Vipava Valley, Karst, Lower Friuli, Colli Orientali and Brda through new experimental/demonstrative field trials, meetings, video lessons, and new guidelines for winegrowers with the support of national/regional agricultural policies.

The project aims to promote the optimization of irrigation strategies and knowledge transfer in cross-border vineyards and beyond; showcase experiments on irrigation and vineyard soil management using innovative green technologies; offer training and promotion through workshops, video lessons, and international conferences; and provide expert support to decisionmakers and stakeholders in the agricultural sector to help them adapt to climate change.

OUTPUT

With twenty technical meetings, activities and trials were managed in eight cross-border vineyards, with physical-chemical analyses of grapes, soil, and plants using DSS and multispectral analyses. Guidelines for irrigation and soil management are being developed, along with updates to the Irrigavit.eu platform. Two tastings of experimental wines in Italy and Slovenia, workshops, and an information campaign promoted the transfer of knowledge to viticulturists.

Karst Firewall 5.0 project addresses two challenges in the program area: wildfires and the wildfire risk governance. It aims to develop innovative action plans to preserve the health of the Karst region and maximize its resilience, with a forward-looking approach. Wildfires in the Karst region are primarily a result of ongoing climate change, as indicated by studies attributing changes in the wildfire regime to climate change.

OBIETTIVI

The project aims to facilitate a better dialogue and collaboration among stakeholders directly involved in wildfire response and management on both sides of the border, as well as among actors from various sectors, including the broader community affected by wildfires. The Karst Firewall project aims to significantly contribute to the development of an effective cross-border mechanism for wildfire prevention and management, given the complementary roles played by all involved actors.

OUTPUT

The Karst Firewall 5.0 project launched its first work package, which focused on fire risk analysis, developing a predictive model, and engaging stakeholders. Collaboration among partners was strengthened to define GIS-based risk analysis methodologies and wildfire algorithm datasets. Preparatory activities for the second work package have started, including drone analysis, equipment selection, and procurement procedures for adaptation measures.

Due to climate change and the resulting increasing risk of fires in the natural environment, the project aims to prepare preventive measures to protect against fires in the cross-border Karst area, with an emphasis on protecting the population and settlements. Project partners, in cooperation with various expert institutions and other stakeholders, will develop joint solutions to prevent the risk of accidents.

The project includes an analysis of the situation and an action plan to unify measures in the cross-border Karst area. Based on the plan, public tenders will be announced in the pilot area to implement preventive measures aimed at individuals and legal entities in various sectors. Protective devices will be purchased, and training programs will be developed to support the implementation of preventive measures.

OUTPUT

Workshops and inter-sectoral meetings were held in cooperation with partners and expert institutions, leading to the development of a Situation Analysis and an Action Plan for Preventive Actions in the Karst area. A draft call was prepared and presented at six workshops in November and December 2024. Fire brigades purchased the necessary equipment and conducted prevention training.

The Kras4us project addresses challenges related to protection and preservation of biodiversity in the unique and endangered Karst region. Three pilot actions will be carried out to preserve and restore green infrastructure, such as grasslands, ponds, and dry-stone walls. The project will also assess the biodiversity status in fire-affected areas, and will carry out the monitoring of selected less monitored indicator species for the first time.

MAIN PROJECT OBJECTIVES

The main goals of the project are to preserve and restore biodiversity in the cross-border Karst by monitoring indicator species and maintaining green infrastructure. The project also aims to develop a strategy for the sustainable management of Natura 2000 species and habitats, promoting circular economy practices and studying the use of waste biomass from fire-affected areas and overgrowing Karst pastures for energy production.

OUTPUT

In spring and summer 2024, indicator bird and butterfly species were surveyed in the fire-affected area, and nesting sites of the Short-toed snake eagle were recorded. In Slovenian Karst, one hectare of forest was cleared, and woody overgrowth removed. Grass mixtures will be sown for long-term grassland preservation. Dry stone walls were cleaned, benefiting the eagle's feeding habits and biodiversity. Preparations for contractor selection for the circular economy study were completed.

The common challenge in the program area is protecting and preserving high levels of biodiversity from the Alps to the sea through the Karst, with particular emphasis on Natura 2000 sites. The PALLIPES project aims to support and improve white-clawed crayfish (Austropotamobius pallipes) populations in the Italian-Slovenian cross-border area, where the species' conservation status is currently critical. This species serves as an excellent biological indicator of habitat quality and biodiversity in aquatic ecosystems.

MAIN PROJECT OBJECTIVES

The project aims to monitor crayfish distribution in Natura 2000 sites, identify and restore degraded habitats, and improve water quality in the Timavo/Reka river through upgrading the Ilirska Bistrica treatment plant and cleaning up illegal dumping sites. The project will also work on eradicating invasive alien species and developing an integrated cross-border strategy for species conservation.

OUTPUT

Project partners started monitoring activities by collecting water samples during summer 2024. The samples were sent to the University of Trieste, who began sampling for eDNA (environmental DNA) research. Using specialized instruments, invisible traces (gametes, bodily fluids) of A. pallipes presence were detected in the water samples. The theatre play "Zaobljuba reki" (Promise to the River) was presented in elementary schools in Italy and Slovenia.

The RECREATE project addresses the Program Area's challenge of transitioning to a circular economy by proposing a circular economy model for fiber-reinforced composite materials (CFR). This model aims to enhance environmental sustainability by reducing waste production and improving CFR waste management.

MAIN PROJECT OBJECTIVES

The project builds on the results of Retracking and proposes a circular economy model to recycle CFR waste into new products, involving an Italian public body and a Slovenian company. The main objectives are collect and prepare CFR waste, define replicable guidelines for waste management, produce certified goods to be used in public spaces or production processes, and develop acquisition and export protocols aligned with regulations.

OUTPUT

The "Recycling Composite Materials" event was organised, which involved the public and stakeholders. Cross-border guidelines for CFR waste were finalized, waste treatment training was held, and the recycled product catalog was presented. The waste collection campaign in Spinea is completed, and prototypes for street furniture are under development. The export process from Technol to Gees Recycling is ongoing, awaiting approval from the relevant authorities.

The aim is to develop an innovative common methodology, through the promotion and exchange of historical data related to geo-hydrological processes, torrent control works and mitigation strategies. The project will test the applicability of the joint methodology in pilot areas, and demonstrate the usefulness of a common intervention guidelines to address torrent management issues.

MAIN PROJECT OBJECTIVES

The main objective of the project is to establish shared and transnational guidelines to monitor the status and functionality of torrent control works. The goal is to allow long-term effectiveness studies of water management structures, that are needed to prioritise the maintenance interventions.

OUTPUT

The project has published two documents, the "Pilot Areas Report" and "Shared Field Forms and Shared Workflows". The development of a standard protocol for data collection is still in the planning stage, the protocol will include: a historical database of torrent control works and basin management actions. This data will be integrated with existing remote sensing data from the pilot areas.

The focus is on climate change and the protection of Pinna nobilis, a species at risk of extinction, with the goal of developing shared management strategies. Concrete actions are supported by communication and training activities that promote a cross-border vision and ensure its transferability and sustainability.

MAIN PROIECT OBIECTIVES

The aim is to improve the management of Northern Adriatic protected areas through replicable best practices, such as the Climate Change Monitoring Network and a transboundary strategy for P. nobilis management. The main innovation lies in the joint approach, delivering regional-scale results.

OUTPUT

Geological, geophysical, and photogrammetric surveys are underway. Using larval collectors, 50 juveniles of P. nobilis were collected, genetic characterization started, and temperature sensors installed. Networking activities took place with other European projects, such as Poseidone, and news were shared widely via the website, social media, and YouTube.. Valves of P. nobilis were collected to study their role as engineering species.

Bilingual questionnaires were developed to map needs of stakeholders in the cross-border area. Dissemination activities were implemented to reach a broader audience.

The WASTE DESIGN 2.0 project addresses climate change and sustainable development by promoting a circular economy through better waste management. Goals include increasing waste separation and raising awareness of reuse. Innovative initiatives, such as ecological islands with digital monitoring systems and urban furniture made from recycled materials, will be supported by cross-border workshops to engage local residents. The project helps reduce environmental impacts and ${\rm CO_2}$ emissions through cross-border cooperation.

MAIN PROJECT OBJECTIVES

The goal of the WASTE DESIGN 2.0 project is to support the transition to a circular economy by improving waste management and promoting its processing and reuse to reduce environmental impact. This will be achieved through pilot investments, digital technologies to monitor container fullness, prototypes of urban furniture made from recycled waste, and joint cross-border actions to raise awareness about waste separation and reuse.

OUTPUT

As part of the WASTE DESIGN 2.0 project, two study visits were carried out, together with the installation of two new submersible ecological islands with fullness sensors in Postojna, and a study on the possibilities of reusing "smaller" construction waste with innovative technologies was carried out. 

The project organizes workshops and tastings to transfer knowledge and introduce good practices. It aims to upgrade the digital map of the Karst Wine Route by setting up a digital Teran museum in Štanjel. This contributes to the protection of Karst heritage, the preservation of the population, and the reduction of daily migration in the cross-border Karst region.

MAIN PROJECT OBJECTIVES

The AGROTUR+ project builds on the results of previous projects (Agrotour and Agrotour II) to promote agricultural and tourism development in the cross-border Karst region. 

The aim is to promote sustainable tourism, digitize heritage, and foster social responsibility through a participatory approach and innovative methods.

OUTPUT

The DANTE project is in its initial phase. Initial activities included the preparation and analysis of the cross-border questionnaire for mapping cultural tourism resources, stakeholder workshops to develop the literary tourism model, and a study visit to the founder of "Il cammino di Dante." The transferable cross-border literary tourism model is currently under preparation as the foundation for future activities.

The DATIS project focuses on improving accessibility and inclusive practices in tourism in the cross-border area of Italy and Slovenia. It promotes digital accessibility, social inclusion and sustainable solutions for people with different disabilities. The project brings together multidisciplinary expertise to develop tools, strategies and guidelines that enable equal accessibility to tourism services, products and facilities and contribute to the sustainable development of inclusive tourism.

MAIN PROJECT OBJECTIVES

The DATIS project focuses on enhancing digital accessibility and social inclusion in tourism for people with disabilities and the elderly in the Italy-Slovenia cross-border region. Key objectives include assessing tourism accessibility through research, developing a shared strategy and guidelines, training 100 providers via cross-border workshops, creating a multilingual accessibility guide, a WCAG-compliant portal, and testing inclusive solutions through innovative pilot projects in museums.

OUTPUT

Since April 2024, the DATIS project has made significant progress by selecting 50 Italian and 50 Slovenian tourism providers and establishing a detailed methodology for digital accessibility evaluations. Communication with providers is ongoing, with a promotion strategy ready to launch in 2025. Trainings are planned for February and March 2025. The project also carried out a survey on accessible tourism, which was completed in December 2024.



PROJECT

Inter Bike III is the third project continuing the development of the area along the 1000 km Adriabike cycling route between Kranjska Gora and Ravenna. It focuses on promoting the D7 Robič-Jelšane and FVG3 Gorizia-Sacile cycling routes, which will be connected in summer 2025 by a van service for cyclists between the Vipava Valley and Cividale del Friuli. A new boat service for cyclists will be launched on the River Lemene between Caorle and Concordia Sagittaria, also operating in part of the Caorle lagoon.

MAIN PROJECT OBJECTIVES

The project aims to promote the development of cycling tourism in the cross-border area from the Julian Alps to Venice. This will be achieved by introducing new services (van and boat transfers, bike rental), by setting up infrastructure for cyclists (e-bike charging stations, bike repair tool racks) and by creating a new cross-border cycling tourism product linking Friuli, Gorizia, Karst and Brkini with Kvarner.

OUTPUT

So far, the partners have detailed the D7 and FVG3 long-distance connections, and a new cycling tourism product is being developed. A bridge has been built on the river Lemene at Cavanella in Concordia Sagittaria for the landing of a boat, which will be co-funded by the project and will sail inland from the resort of Caorle along the river. In the Coastal-Karst region, public bus passenger transport lines are being analysed with a view to proposing improvements.



The WALKofPeace+ project aims to respond to the challenge of attracting more tourists through a joint cross-border offer. Building on the success of the previous WALKofPeace project (best INTERREG 2020 project), it created the WoP brand with a 500 km route linking over 300 monuments. The project also focused on heritage conservation related to World War I and promoting it as a sustainable cultural tourism product.

MAIN PROJECT OBJECTIVES

The project aims to enhance the use of tangible and intangible heritage through site adjustments, historical research on World War I, and diversified tourist approaches. It seeks to develop multilevel governance to institutionalize the WoP project for long-term sustainability. The project also focuses on strengthening and standardizing the WoP path's communicative identity and promotion, involving visitors, institutions, and locals, while coordinating communication and promotional activities.

OUTPUT

In 2024, all planned project activities were completed. The two municipalities began designing the open-air museum route on Monte Ermada, including historical panels. Studies were conducted for the Walk of Peace bike route and the Italian side of Monte Sabotino. The app development has started, the Memorandum of Understanding was signed, and the Walk of Peace Product Club was established. 

It also revises major emergency response protocols, develops a unified organizational model, and introduces a comprehensive training program with practical sessions and a demonstration event (DEMO).

OUTPUT

The three major emergency protocols (NEX AID) were revised to include out-of-hospital care (Health Centres). Advanced training for healthcare staff has started, with some sessions already completed. A specialized vehicle for logistics, material mobilization, and communications is nearly ready. The project will reach its apex in May 2025 with a cross-border large-scale emergency simulation.

PROJECT SUMMARY



The CO ADRIA project aims to address the common challenge of climate change in the Italy-Slovenia programme area, in order to contribute to the achievement of climate neutrality by 2050. This will be done through the coordination of shared initiatives by setting up a joint structure, overcoming cross-border administrative barriers, for the achievement of climate neutrality through new approaches and behaviors.

Friuli-Venezia Giulia, Veneto, and Slovenia are collectively addressing the challenge of an aging population in the Program area. The aim is to strengthen cooperation and governance of public-private decision-making processes between institutions and key operators in social and health services for elderly care. Starting in October 2023 and ending in spring 2025, the CrossCare 2.0 project is a capitalization initiative building on the Model developed through the previous CrossCare® project.

MAIN POLICY OBJECTIVE

The project aims to develop shared strategies and improve coordination of existing services. Its innovative approach promotes dialogue to establish cross-border Community Pacts at the local level, supporting an integrated and tailored care model for the elderly and their families. This model will leverage synergy between public and private services, with collaboration from civil society and all relevant formal and informal organizations.

OUTPUT

Bilingual guidelines of the CrossCare® Model have been developed, and a cross-border training course conducted. As part of the testing of the CrossCare model, Community Pacts in six territories have been finalised. Network and community initiatives, like the Social Concierge, have been promoted, and the Moto Cognitive Protocol tested. Changes in beneficiaries are evaluated through the Polar Scheme and Therapeutic Arc, with technical support from Fondazione Zancan.

The project addresses the management of linguistic diversity in crossborder public administration, improving the quality and efficiency of language services through common strategies for the standardisation of legal-administrative terminology. Through a cross-border partnership and participatory solutions, it will develop common models and accessible ICT tools for a sustainable and inclusive impact, involving target groups and the public.

MAIN PROJECT OBJECTIVES

To enhance language services in cross-border public administration by standardising legal-administrative terminology in programme languages. The project will develop participative, sustainable, and inclusive models and tools involving target groups and users, driving a transformative shift in multilingual management through a shared strategic document, standardised models, and accessible ICT tools.

OUTPUT

The three focus groups on good practices and needs of bilingualism in public administration showed that in all three linguistic contexts analysed (Italian in Slovenia and Slovenian and Friulian in Italy), the effectiveness of the initiatives implemented varies according to the specific territorial context. The conference highlighted the need for highly bilingual staff, who are continuously trained and who also act as mediators for the use of minority languages in public administration.

PROJECT SUMMARY



The project addresses the lack of cross-border accessibility for vulnerable groups (e.g., persons with disabilities, the blind, and the deaf). While the development of digitalization has accelerated in recent years, accessibility requirements are often inconsistently applied. The goal of the DigARegion project is to streamline the provision of comprehensive accessibility that includes all individuals, regardless of barriers, with a focus on the cultural identities of vulnerable groups.

MAIN PROJECT OBJECTIVES

By enhancing collaboration and involving local stakeholders in the process of building and strengthening competencies in digital accessibility, the project aims to meet the accessibility needs of vulnerable groups. To achieve this, a platform will be established to promote and develop digital accessibility and serve as a cooperation hub for the region.

OUTPUT

The project is in its initial phase, and the kick-off meeting took place in November. In line with project requirements, the members of the Project Steering Committee and the Project Management Committee have been appointed.
